Please Avoid Our EQAO Administration Dates

Between May 22nd 2018 and June 4th 2018 students in Grade 3 and Grade 6 will be taking part in the provincial Assessment of Reading, Writing and Mathematics, Primary Division (Grades 1–3) and Junior Division (Grades 4-6). This assessment is administered to all Grade 3 and Grade 6 students in Ontario's publicly funded school system by the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO), an independent agency of the Government of Ontario.

While the exact dates for the administration of Assessment of Reading, Writing and Mathematics, Primary Division and Junior Division are still being finalized

for the school, we would kindly ask that you avoid planning appointments, vacations or breaks that may make your child absent during this two week period. Our thanks, in advance.



Safe Arrival Program

Through a directive from the Ministry of Education and Training, all School Boards are to implement a safe arrivals program in their schools. The York Region District School Board has been working



very closely with the York Regional Police to ensure the safety of our students. The safe arrival program at Glenn Gould P.S. depends on parents notifying the office in the event their child is late for school or absent from school.

All parents and guardians are reminded to please call the school (905) 417-4517 option #7 (attendance line) if their child is going to be absent or late. You may leave a message on the answering machine. Please leave your child's last and first name, teacher's name, and the reason for the absence. The school will take the following steps if a child's absence from school remains unknown:

Step One:

Call the student's home.

Step Two:

If there is no answer, the school will call the parents/guardians at work or their cell phones.

Step Three:

If there is no response, the school will call the emergency contact person.

Step Four:

If the contact person cannot be reached then the school will notify the York Regional Police that a child is missing.

Please remember to call the school if your child will be late or absent, especially in the event of a religious holiday.

You may be interested to know that the secretary often spends over an hour daily following up on the numerous unreported absences. Each year we contact York Regional Police to assist in finding a 'missing child'. In each case the child is found with his/her parent. Please help out by being conscientious about phoning the school when your child is going to be absent or late. Our phone lines are available 7 days, 24 hours.

Summer Institute offers academic, recreational and athletic programs and activities with intentional links to the Ontario Curriculum. The program runs for six weeks during July and August. It is offered at 11 school sites around York Region.

Registration opens March 7, 2018. Families can now register online, as well as in person or by mail.

Base Registration Weekly Fees:

York Region District School Board students: \$105 (4 day weeks) \$120 (5 day weeks)

Non- York Region District School Board students: \$130 (4 day weeks) \$155 (5 day weeks)

Parking Lot, Bus Loop and Street Safety

Like you, we plan on your child arriving to and from school safely. For this purpose, the Board has provided the school with two separate driveways. On the South side of the school, is a "Kiss'N Ride" loop for parents. The parking spaces in the "Kiss'N Ride" loop are for school staff only. On the East side of the school, is a "Bus Loop" for school buses and taxis. Parents are asked not to use this loop for student pick-up, drop-off or for parking. Do not park your vehicle at the front of the school at any time. There is plenty of parking on many of the side streets for up to 3 hours. Feel free to park and walk your child over to our school.

Some students are not eligible for bussing while others are, as they live within the Board mandated walking distances. **We strongly encourage you to walk your child to and from school.**

Kiss N' Ride and Bus Loop

The "Kiss'N Ride" loop is identified by signs and designated for parents and family members pickingup or dropping-off children. Please do not drop of students on Vellore Park Ave or Highmark Dr., as it is not safe for students to walk through a Kiss N' Ride or Bus Loop.

We are asking parents to follow the rules below when using the Kiss n' Ride Loop:

- 1. Arrive to school between 8:50 a.m. and 9:00 a.m..
- 2. Drive all the way through the loop and only drop off your children in the Drop-Off zone. Please see map.
- 3. Pull all the way up into the drop off zone—8 10 cars can drop off at the same time.
- 4. Please maintain your cue, and avoid passing/overtaking cars already in a cue. Please move up your car as space become available in the cue.
- 5. Students should have their backpacks ready on their laps.
- 6. To ensure a quick and safe drop-off or pickup, parents are not to get out of the vehicle.
- 7. Students are to exit from the passenger side of the vehicle ONLY.
- 8. Students should never walk through the parking lot or bus loop.
- 9. End of day Pick-Up: You will have to circle the loop, exit onto Highmark and re-enter the loop if your child is not ready for pick-up at the end of the day.
- Park your car on the street if you have younger children who need assistance (in order to reduce congestion in the drop off zone).
- 11. Use your signal to merge when exiting the drop off zone.
- Please follow instructions given by Glenn Gould staff monitoring the parking lot.

We need your cooperation to ensure the safety of all students, parents and staff.



Kindergarten Registration Continues



Kindergarten registration started Friday, January 19, 2018 for the 2018-2019 school year, and has continued since that day. Families may register their child(ren) by visiting the school main office from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and completing the required documents. Please bring the following supporting documents (originals required) when registering your child(ren):

- Proof of child's age (Birth Certificate/Passport)
- Proof of your child's address two documents, one from each of the categories below showing the home address;
- Category A notice of tax assessment, current rental/lease agreement, agreement to purchase
 including proof of purchase provided before the pupil attends the school, or property tax bill, and
- Category B utility bill, bank statement or other official document.

Note: Family living with relatives or friends must provide a letter of residency from the friend/relative, a property tax bill, and one utility bill in the name of the friend/relative.



Monthly Wellness Tip

It's your head – use it!

Head injuries are the leading cause of serious injury and death to kids on wheels. Wearing a properly fitted, certified helmet can reduce the risk of serious head injury by 85 per cent. Children and youth under 18 years of age are required by law to wear a helmet when bicycling. Helmets must fit properly to protect your child in the event of a crash.



Remember the 2V1 Shake, Shake, Shake rule:

- 2: The helmet should cover the top of your child's head and sit two finger widths above his or her eyebrows. A helmet that is too big will not provide proper protection
- V: Adjust the side straps so they form a V-shape under your child's ears
- 1: Only one finger should fit between your child's chin and the fastened straps Shake, Shake: Have your child shake his or her head up and down and side to side to make sure the helmet is snug.

Skateboarding safety


Skateboarding is a great way for children to be physically active. However, it involves a tricky combination of balance, coordination and speed on hard surfaces, so there is always the risk of injury. Injuries from falls are common due to a child's limited judgment skills and strength, and the challenge of maneuvering a skateboard on pavement. Younger children have slower reaction times and a higher centre of gravity, and children and youth who skateboard in the street are at an increased risk of being hit by motor vehicles.



Tips:

Always supervise children between the ages of five to 10 Make sure children wear skateboard helmets and other protective gear such as elbow pads, knee pads and wrist guards Go to a supervised skate park, or find places for your child to ride such as playgrounds, parks and rinks with smooth surfaces, far away from cars
