# Principal and Vice Principal's Report

# GGPS School Council - February Principal's / Vice-Principal's Report

- 1. We are working on bringing more arts-based presentations into the school this year. Two weeks ago, we had Education Arts Canada come in to present a musical play called "Math Jam" for our K-3 students. The show incorporated math concepts along with music and dancing. On February 28, our Grade 3-5 classes will be learning how to Soca dance along with learning the cultural significance of this Caribbean dance. On March 1, we will be having a presentation by Babarinde Williams who incorporates traditional African drumming and music along with teaching about Black Canadian Heroes.
- 2. We have purchased various new pieces of technology to support the teaching of Coding, which is now a part of the Math and Science curricula. We have purchased Microbits, Climate Action kits to go along with the Microbits, Blue Bots, Lego Robotics, along with 30 additional Chromebooks and 20 iPads to support the use of technology in the classrooms.
- 3. Ms. Lindsay Kemble is our new Gifted Grade 5/6 teacher, replacing Ms. Gaspar who had to go on a medical/maternity leave for the rest of the school year.
- 4. We plan to hold a spring dance on Thursday, March 9, just before the March Break. We will collect food for the Food Bank and the Grade 8 classes will sell refreshments as a fundraiser for their graduation. A playlist will be created and supplied to the student DJ before the dance.
- 5. Mr. DiLecce has started a Cursive Writing club for Junior students.
- 6. Our PRO grant request has been approved so we will have \$800 to support a Family Math Night. We are looking at late April, early May. Our School Math team will be meeting to plan the event.
- 7. Our Affirming Black Identity through Visual Arts project with special guest Benny Bing, is happening this Friday for Grade 7 and 8 classes. Parents are invited to attend Mr. Bing's initial presentation from 9:15-9:45, before he goes and works with the students in their classrooms. Corporate Communications for the Board will also be attending on Friday and will be interviewing students and staff about Celebrating Black Excellence.
- 8. Our school SAFE team had a very successful Bell Let's Talk Day, with several initiatives around positive mental health for all of our students. Our next focus will be Pink Shirt Day and Anti-Bullying messages to go along with that on February 22nd.
- 9. A Parent Engagement Survey has been sent to all parents. We have extended the deadline in hopes of having more parents complete the survey. The information that is gathered from the survey will be used to help us develop our School Improvement Plan.
