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Principal and Vice Principal's Report

- Tomorrow is our Spring Dance. All classes will have an opportunity to take part in the dance with music by our own "DJ J-Boogie". Students are asked to bring in a non-perishable food item for the Vaughan Food Bank. There will be treats and glow sticks on sale for \$1 or \$2. Students who do not wish to participate may choose to play board games or read in the library.
- 2. We are planning a Family Math Night for Wed. May 24th from 6-8 pm. The evening will have an Amazing Race theme and will include games, challenges, prizes and take-aways.
- 3. Our Grade 8 classes will be hosting a Bingo Night grad fundraiser on Wednesday, April 12th. There will be pizza served from 6:00-6:30 and Bingo from 6:30-7:30. There will be prizes for the winners.
- 4. Our visit from artist, Benny Bing, to celebrate Black Excellence went very well. The Grade 7 and 8 students learned a lot and were inspired by Mr. Bing's art and story. Our school is currently featured on the YRDSB website with a video about the experience featuring several of our students.
- 5. Our SAFE team is continuing to promote various mental health and equity initiatives. For International Women's Day today, The students on the SAFE team delivered wristbands to our female staff.
- 6. The Lego Robotics club will be starting after March Break on Tuesdays and Wednesdays at lunch in the library for Grades 5-8. We will also be starting a Lego Club for primary students (replacing the Primary Colouring Club) during morning recesses.
- 7. Our Intermediate Boys basketball team finished their season, placing 5th in the Area. Our Intermediate Girls team will be participating in the Area playoffs this Thursday. Junior Basketball tryouts for the boys have started, and the girls will be starting after the March Break. - 8. Last Friday, we had a visit from the Director of Education, Scott Yake. Mr. Yake came for a tour of the school and was pleased to see all of the great things happening at GGPS.
- 9. Ms. Malfara will be starting another session of "You're the Chef" for the Grade 7 students who were not able to participate in the January/February session due to lack of space. This will be starting at the end of March.

Treasurer's Financial Report

The current account balance is \$8915.30. Boston Pizza will still need to be paid for two weeks which will be about \$2700. Therefore, we have approximately \$6215 in our account.

This year's session was attended by Trisha Sankarsingh and Angela Endrizzi on behalf of the GGPS School Council.

The session kicked off with a review of the mental health approach strategy:

- The strategy was updated for 2022/2023 school year
- Focus is on the inter-related parts:
 - Within individuals
 - Examples: gifts/assets, emotion, self & spirit
 - Between individuals
 - Examples: relationships, friends, resources
 - Around individuals
 - Examples: environment, family, learning, faith, culture, background & community
- Focus is also on the fact that mental health is not a one size fits all approach, is to be viewed as a spectrum and considers:
 - Identities
 - Environment
 - \circ Experiences
- Strategy in school...
 - Within promoting mental health
 - Between implementing identity affirming and culturally responsive approaches
