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Principal's Report ~sent by Mr. Barlow

1. Progress reports will be going home next week (on Tuesday). Electronic copies will be sent the week of November 21st, but we wanted paper copies to go home before the Parent-Teacher interviews. Interviews will be held on the evening of Thursday, November 17th and morning of Friday, November 18th. Parents can book their preferred times now in Edsby.
2. We will be having our Remembrance Day ceremony this Friday starting at 9:45. Parents are welcome to attend.
3. In addition to the sports and clubs that I mentioned at our last meeting, we have several more extracurricular activities that are starting for our younger students. We have Grade 1 intramurals starting at morning recesses. They will run for 3 weeks, followed by Grade 2 and Grade 3 intramurals. Our Junior Volleyball team is starting tryouts this week. We also have a Tie Dye Club starting this week for Junior students. Our Grade 1 to 8 choir is continuing to practise twice a week and will be singing at our Remembrance Day ceremony.
4. We have several important dates coming up:
 - November 17 - Class photos and photo retakes
 - November 18 - PA Day
 - November 21 - Dental screening for JK, SK, 2, 8, and possibly other grades
 - November 22 - Immunization Clinic for Gr. 7 and 8

5. Our SAFE team has been meeting regularly to discuss issues that are happening in the school and coming up with positive initiatives that support student wellness. The students have worked on creating Positive Messages jars that are going to be distributed to each classroom.
6. This week, Mr. Meagher and Ms. Iaboni are starting meetings for our new GSA club. GSA stands for Gender and Sexuality Alliance and is open to any students from Grades 5 to 8 who either identify as 2SLGBTQI+, or consider themselves allies. Their purpose is to provide a safe space where students can support one another, discuss issues of concern and discuss how to make GGPS a more safe and inclusive place for everyone.




