POSSIBLE COUNCIL EVENTS 2019-20*

- o Box of Cards Ms. Acciaccaferri:
 - 33 greeting cards for \$33
 - The school gets back \$11 per box
 - We want to ask if the cards are different, and which box of cards it is
 - If orders in before March 15th, delivery charge is waived
- Fresh Flowers Vandermeer Nursery Ms. Besharah
 - Potted plants cost to customer \$11-40
 - \$3-\$7 profit per order
 - Consider the poinsettia for next year close to the holidays
- Eco Friendly Products Our Planet– Ms. Besharah
 - Minimum order is \$250
 - Free Shipping over \$500
 - Reusable bags; steel straws, bamboo cutlery sets
- Purdy's Ms. McQuinn
 - \$500 minimum order
 - 25% profit
 - No nut free option for the regular boxes
 - There is also a fundraising option, and the profit is 50% and there is a single peanut free option
 - Maybe look at Laura Secord
- Mom's Pantry Ms. Murphy
 - Offers different food options cookie dough, butter spreads, croissants, seasonings
 - \$1500 minimum
 - ~37% profit
 - Only issue is storage for frozen items
- o Little Caesar's Ms. McLaughlin
 - \$6 profit per pizza kit ordered
 - Need lots of storage space and must be distributed same day delivered
- QSP Ms. Acciaccaferri
 - Another option is to continue this fundraiser as we have in past years

 - o We have decided to go forward with the Big Box of Cards to be ordered by mid-March
 - o Ms. Acciaccaferri to contact company for sample box, order forms, etc

 - Clothing
 - Food items
 - Diapers
 - We can do a fundraiser as a school to help with the donations
 - We could assign an item for each grade to help come up with donations

 - o We can also advertise that this event is available for those in need
