FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL ROUTINES



Here are some simple instructions to assist us with organizing classes on September 2nd.
All students will meet on the tarmac to begin. Students in grades 1-2 will meet at the west doors closest to Conover. Students in grades 3 - 5 will meet at the northwest section of the tarmac and students in grades 6 - 8 will meet at the northeast section of the tarmac.

• Senior Kindergarten students will meet at the KG are in the front of the school. Junior Kindergarten students will arrive at times indicated by letters received in late

June or early July.

- Teachers will have signs indicating their name and grade level. Each homeroom teacher will have a class list to indicate which students are in their class. A table will also be set up outside portable 1 where non-homeroom teachers will have class lists to assist with the placements. Students whose names do not appear on any of the lists will report to the main office.
- If it is a rainy day, students will be directed to areas inside the school where they will meet in grade levels and then will be picked up by teachers.

We hope that these instructions will assist all of our families when they arrive on the first day.

TEDDY BEAR PICNIC


