




Greetings Hartman Families,

Parking in the front school loop is only for parents delivering children to the daycare

Any student in grades 1-8 should be dropped off in the Kiss'n'Ride in the parking lot at the north end of the lot as designated by the signs

Please respect the pylons that are in place for safety and order – they are not to be moved at any time!

There must always be a lane for cars to pass through – do not leave your car if you are blocking anyone from moving their vehicle

Please do not use your horn on board property – it only serves to scare children

Thank you for being patient – our goal is the safe arrival and pick up of all students who are arriving via an automobile Staff are on duty to receive students between 8.45 - 9.00 a.m. each day

## Hartman Heroes—Sports Update


