Dear Parents and Guardians:

Eco and Healthy Schools

At Hartman, we continue to work hard to reduce the amount of garbage created through lunch waste. Parents play a very important role in making sure students' lunches are healthy and waste-free. Our goal is to generate no waste at lunches. To help, here are some suggestions for packing lunches that are healthy and eco friendly:



- Label your reusable containers and utensils to ensure they make it home each day
- A small icepack in a thermal lunch bag will keep food and beverages cool and fresh
- Only pack as much food as your child will eat to reduce waste
- Read food labels and choose products with as little saturated and trans fats as possible; limit foods and beverages high in calories, fat, sugar or sodium
- Take your children grocery shopping with you and encourage them to select their favourite fruits,
 vegetable and healthy food items to stock your fridge and pantry
- Remember that many of our students and staff have serious nut allergies, so don't include any items that contain nuts

RE: School Bus Cancellation Notice

On occasion service cancellation due to inclement weather conditions may be required.

To ensure all education partners (staff, parents and students) understand how they can be informed of any service cancellation, please take the appropriate steps to distribute the attached **School Bus Cancellation**Notice.

Suggestions for sharing the information include but are not limited to:

- · Sending copies home with students;
- Sending copies home in Report Card envelopes;
- Including notice in school newsletters and/or websites.
- Posting Notice in appropriate locations (hallways, staff rooms);

A decision to cancel school bus transportation will be **region-wide** meaning all buses, vans and taxis will not operate.

Parents, students and school staff are asked to access local radio and television stations after 6:00 a.m. to receive bus cancellation information. A bus cancellation message will also be available at www.schoolbuscity.com and 1-877-330-3001 or by following the YRDSB on Twitter.

Please note that school bus charters will not operate when regular home to school service is cancelled.
