SPRING—Rainy and Wet Weather

With the arrival of spring comes wet and rainy days! Please make sure that you have a conversation with your children about fast flowing creeks and rivers. Sometimes this can become a safety issue for children. For the younger children, please make sure you send a dry change of clothes with your child just in case they get wet during recess.



Junior/Senior Kindergarten Registration for September 2014

Children born in 2010 are eligible to attend Junior Kindergarten in September, 2014. Children born in 2009 and not currently attending public school, are eligible for senior kindergarten in September.



Documents required for registration include:

- Proof of child's age (birth certificate/passport)
- Proof of residency (for child and parent/guardian)
- Citizenship and immigration status (where applicable)
- Direction of school support form

Registrations are accepted on a first come, first serve basis.

Safe and Efficient "Drop Off" of Children at School

In order to ensure the safe arrival and dismissal of all of our students, we ask that families work with us as they follow the safety routines during these times.

The safest location for letting students out of your car is in the "Kiss and Ride" in our parking lot. It is important that the students exit the vehicle to the sidewalk side and not the road side. It is helpful if your children already have their backpacks with them in the car as this will speed up the drop off routines. To keep the flow of cars moving in the morning, it is essential that we do not have anyone parking, even for a short time, in the "drop off zone". If you need to walk a student to the door of the school or come into the school office, please park on the street in front of the school and walk in. Do Not drop students off in the Middle of the Parking Lot as they would need to navigate between cars and cannot always be seen. Using the "drop off zone" properly is the safest way to have students arrive at school when they are driven.

No vehicles should enter the bus loop at the front of the school between 8:00 and 8:15. For obvious safety reasons, the bus loop is only for the buses at this time. If you are bringing a student into the daycare at this time, please park on the street in front of the school and walk in along the sidewalk. Just a reminder that the north end of the bus loop has posted "no entry" signs.

The safest location for walkers to cross Via Romano is at the Crossing Guard. Please remind your children to cross with the Crossing Guard as this is the only location that is visible to on-coming traffic.

Thank you for your co-operation in keeping everyone safe.

Developed in collaboration with youth, **Resources Around Me** is an interactive map-based tool that puts the power of Kids Help Phone's community resource database in the hands of youth themselves.

Available online or through Kids Help Phone's free Always There app, **Resources Around Me** allows young people to independently search for trusted local programs and services in their communities, such as counselling and mental health centres, distress services, addictions programs, shelters, housing help, legal help, LGBTQ services, and sexual health clinics.

Kids Help Phone maintains Canada's largest database of youth-serving programs and services – which our professional counsellors use to help young people connect to more support in their communities every day. Resources Around Me makes this information available to young people for the first time, providing access to a portion of this database – 11,000 local resources that offer services to kids directly (even more will be added in the years ahead as funding becomes available).
