School Assistants

School assistants provide supervision inside while the students are eating their

lunch in the classrooms, and outside on the playground while the children are at play. This is a paid position (\$11.97 per hour), requiring one hour of work per day. Requirements include a volunteer screening by the York Region Police and a statement of good health from your family doctor. If you are interested in this position, or know someone who would be interested, please contact the school office the last week of August.

Construction Update

We are eagerly anticipating our Second Floor fill in which will give us 6 more classrooms. The Board and the contractors have indicated that they are hoping that the exterior work will be completed before school opening in September with the interior finish work being completed over the months of September, October and November. One of the day-care rooms will be converted into a Kindergarten room and this will happen during the summer. The construction will begin as soon as the students leave for the summer. As part of the building permit requirements we will be increasing the size of the parking lot. The staff has a very positive attitude going forward and understand that in the end we will have a school that can accommodate our growth. We will be supplying you with regular communications throughout construction. As many of you have lived through the construction of new homes you know we are hoping for good weather and minimal delays. Thank you for your continued support.

We continue to overflow to Silver Pines and now are on overflow for JK and SK students who registered after May 26th. This means any student who registers will be overflowed to Silver Pines. Fortunately we have been able to recall several students as students move out. It would be extremely helpful to the school and those families on the wait list if you would let us know if you are moving for the next school year.

Re: Class Placement for September 2014

You will note that your child's placement has not been included on the report card.

The staff are working diligently to organize our classes to provide the best program for each child, and to comply with the maximum class size allowed.

While we understand that you may wish to know your child's class placement before the start of school, our enrolment may change significantly between now and the first day of school. Therefore, you will be informed of your child's class placement on their first day of attendance in September.

As part of our organization, we will have several straight grade classes and some combined grade classrooms. Combined classes group children from two consecutive grades, e.g., Grades 3 and 4 into one classroom. We do this for many reasons that include organizing classes to meet school needs and combining grades to balance class size. For more information about combined classrooms visit www.edu.gov.on.ca.



Please note that there may be changes prior to the end of September 2014 (class sizes will be reported to the Ministry of Education). We will keep you informed of any changes to your child's class placement should the need arise.
