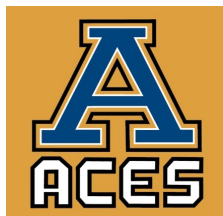

Pride Flag Raising

In honor of Pride Month, York Region District School Board will be hosting a flag raising ceremony. YRDSB celebrates Pride Month every June and works closely with community partners and 2SLGBTQ+ organizations on an ongoing basis to build strong, more inclusive communities that celebrate diversity. The ceremony will take place at the Aurora Education Centre on Thursday, June 6, 2019 from 9:30 am—10:00 am.

The Pride Flag is internally recognized as a symbol of pride, hope and diversity. In 1978, Gilbert Baker, a San Francisco artist, designed the Pride Flag as a response to the need for a symbol to support LGBT rights movement. The current flag has six stripes, each with its own meaning.



We will be supporting Pride Month by raising the Pride Flag for the first time ever at Carnegie on Friday, June 7, 2019 at 12:15pm. In honor of Pride Month, we will be creating, at designated times throughout the week, a school wide mural. This mural will be a large heart shaped rainbow made of different coloured origami butterflies.
