Construction Update



We are eagerly anticipating our Second Floor fill in which will give us 6 more classrooms. The Board and the contractors have indicated that they are hoping that the exterior work will be completed before school opening in September with the interior finish work being completed over the months of September, October and November. One of the daycare rooms will be converted into a Kindergar-

ten room and this will happen during the summer. The construction will begin as soon as the students leave for the summer. As part of the building permit requirements we will be increasing the size of the parking lot and this will begin the day after our BBQ and Fun Fair. The staff has a very positive attitude going forward and understand that in the end we will have a school that can accommodate our growth. We will be supplying you with regular communications throughout construction. As many of you have lived through the construction of new homes you know we are hoping for good weather and minimal delays. Thank you for your continued support.

BOOMERANG PROGRAM and REFILLABLE WATER STATION

ENERGY CONSUMPTION

At Herbert H. Carnegie Public School, we conserve energy. One thing we do is a light check for each classroom. Our kindergarten classes went from classroom to classroom checking to see if the lights were on while the rest of the school was doing the 20 Minute Makeover. For Earth Hour, we turn off all lights and electronic equipment and use as much natural light as possible. In the front foyer, we have a bulletin board that monitors how much energy we used during each hour of the day every week. Our staff and students can see the usage of energy and refer to the graph to reduce energy consumption. We put "Monitor Off" stickers on our computer screens to remind our students to fully shutdown the computers when they are not in use. At Carnegie, we also have the RET program. R stands for recycling, E stands for energy and T stands for tidiness. Every week the caretakers go to each classroom to check for each of these three categories. Carnegie continues to make positive decisions on how to help the environment!

Student Busing Eligibility

Did you know that students' busing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:



- All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.
