

Future Aces / Character Education Focus

As our school is named after a man of tremendous integrity, the development of character is front and center in our school. Herbert Carnegie regularly said, "Make attitude your friend!" and we will, by embracing Dr. Carnegie's Future ACES creed. In ACES, we consider the importance of character attributes such as Attitude, Action, Courage, Confidence, Example, Education, Service and Sportsmanship. Consistent with the Future Aces philosophy are our Board's character and equity initiatives. Our staff will work from a Tribes perspective, focusing on mutual respect and appreciation, attentive listening and active participation. Each community member (our staff, our students and our parents) is expected to assist us in building a positive, inclusive community. In September, we will focus on the character attributes of respect and cooperation.

Creating Safe and Healthy Schools for Children with Allergies

School staff and parents are responsible for creating safe and healthy environments for students. This is an additional challenge for schools attended by children with allergies, especially life-threatening allergies. While it is impossible to create a risk-free environment, school staff and parents can take important steps to minimize potentially fatal allergic reactions as there are implications for the whole school, not just individual classrooms. It is especially important that parents communicate a life-threatening allergy to the school as soon as they are aware of it. Please notify the Principal and your child's teacher, so that we have accurate records and establish the protocol to follow with your child.

Birthday Celebrations

In keeping with the nut-safe policy, please do not send food or other items to school with your child to celebrate his or her birthday. We will celebrate birthdays by announcing them on the morning announcements and by delivering a birthday ribbon.

Office Index Forms

On the first day of school, each of our students will receive a computer generated office index form which will be used in emergency situations. The information on these forms is essential. Please check the accuracy of your child's form, make all necessary changes and/or add information which may be new or important for the school to know, return them with the student the next day.

All Office Index forms must be initialed and returned to the school, even with no changes.

Milk Program for Students

In the next few weeks, we will once again offer milk to our students who stay for lunch. Milk is a healthy option for our students providing them with the opportunity to have a cold beverage. Milk program information will follow shortly.

Nut-Free Snacks

Herbert H. Carnegie Public School is a nut safe environment. We appreciate your support in working towards a safe environment for all of our students. Please read all product labels to ensure that your child is not bringing items to school which contain nuts and traces of nuts. We do have students with very serious allergies. If we become aware of students with other life-threatening allergies, we will inform our school community and develop an appropriately safe response.

<u>Parking</u>

If you are bringing students to school by car, please consider the "Kiss and Ride" at the south end of the school (through the staff parking lot) as your first and safest option. Students get out of the car and PARENTS stay in the car. Please ensure backpacks are with your children in the car where they sit and not in the trunk. For everyone's safety, nobody should be making u-turns on Via Romano. Our crossing guard continues to provide the safest crossing location for walkers on Via Romano before and after school. Please be sure to cross at this designated area. Thank you for helping us to keep everyone safe.



Bus Information

York Region District School Board Policy states that students' walking distance for Kindergarten to grade 3 is 1.2 k.m. and 1.6 k.m. for students from grades 4 - 8. Each student must follow safety and behaviour rules or he/she will not be allowed to ride the bus. Please note the changes for walking distance from Grade 3 to Grade 4.

School Council

We have very dedicated and committed parents in our school community. Council members support our school initiatives in a variety of ways. School Council is a very helpful advisory group which offers suggestions and recommendations to the school administration. As well, the Council members organize many community events, fundraising initiatives and support hot lunch programs. We meet approximately once a month for two hours in the evening. If you are interested in being a member of our School Council, please fill in the form sent home with the school information packages. Our first School Council meeting of the year will take place on Thursday, September 24th at 7:00 p.m. If we have a large number of interested members, School Council will be determined by an election process on this evening. School Council meetings regularly start at 7:00 p.m.

Playground Supervision

Playground supervision begins at 8:00 a.m. Students are supervised outside during morning and lunch recess and after school during bus departure. If you are picking up your child(ren), please arrange to meet him/her/them at their dismissal door. Please try to avoid picking your child up early. If you must, please check-in at the office and we will call your child(ren) from class.



Combined Classes

As part of our organization, we will have several straight grade classes and some combined grade classrooms. Combined classes group children from two consecutive grades (e.g., grades 1 and 2), into one classroom. We do this for many reasons that include organizing classes to meet school needs and combining grades to balance class size. For more information about combined classrooms visit www.edu.gov.on.ca.

Please note that there may be changes prior to the end of September 2015 (class sizes will be reported to the Ministry of Education). We will keep you informed of any changes to your child's class placement should the need arise.

Attendance/Safe Arrival Program

If your child is going to be absent:

- 1) Parents/guardians need to telephone the school (905.417.0211) before 8:15 a.m. to leave a message with your child's name, grade, teacher, and the anticipated length of absence. Inform the school if your child will not be returning for the afternoon or will be late arriving at school.
- 2) If you know days in advance of an absence, we would appreciate a note being sent with your child or a sibling to the school.

If a child is going to arrive late or leave early, please send a note to the school. Students arriving late must sign in the binder at the school office.

IF YOUR CHILD IS NOT AT SCHOOL AND IS NOT ACCOUNTED FOR BY A NOTE OR TELEPHONE CALL, BOARD SAFETY PROTOCOL HAS OUR SCHOOL OFFICE ASSISTANT:

- 1) Call home to check (and if the student is still not accounted for)
- 2) Call the parents at work (and if the child is still not accounted for)
- 3) Call the emergency numbers (and if the child is still not accounted for)
- 4) We will then telephone the York Regional Police if the child is missing

A message can be left on the school voicemail outside of regular school office hours to inform us of student absence.

Visitors to the School

Our school doors will be locked 15 minutes after the school bell rings in the morning and will stay locked for the remainder of the school day. During the school day, all visitors, including parents/quardians, will be required to use the buzzer at the front doors and to sign-in at the main office. All visitors will need to wear a "visitor" tag each time you are in the school. If you are bringing an item for your child or picking up your child for an appointment, after buzzing in and reporting to the office, our office staff will contact the classroom teacher and direct your child to the office. For safety, staff are encouraged to check immediately with adults whom they see in the school or on the playground. Please notify us in writing or by telephone if someone other than the parent/quardian will pick up your child. If you wish to speak with your child's teacher, please call the school to arrange a telephone or personal meeting.

In addition, our front doors will be unlocked after school until our main office closes at 3:30 p.m., at which point the front doors will be locked again. To access the child care centre after 3:30 p.m., please enter through the south-west entrance of the school.

No-Parking Zones

Do not leave your car parked in the <u>Kiss and Ride</u> or <u>bus loop</u> areas. There is no parking in these areas at any time.

Freedom of Information, Protection of Privacy

Information collected by schools on the student registration form and on the emergency form may be disclosed beyond the Board for:

- School Council class lists for pizza lunch days
- In case of an accident or witness to an accident, the student's name and home address will be released to the Board's insurer.
- The use of names, photographs, etc., used for displays in the school, newsletters and yearbooks.
- If you do not consent to the release of information for these purposes, please inform the Principal in writing.
