A Message from the Administration

It's hard to believe that the first month of school is already over. We would like to congratulate our students and staff for such a great beginning to the year. H.G. Bernard PS has since undergone a re-organization. As explained in other communications, these changes were necessary in response to an increase in enrolment and to meet the Ministry of Education primary class size requirements and Junior and Intermediate class size averages. Teachers put a lot of thought and care into the decisions that were made to ensure the best classroom placement for each student. The team at H.G. Bernard has been incredible at supporting each other, our students, and our parents to understand that changes were necessary.

The York Region District School Board has designated the week of September 30-October 4 as Safety Awareness Week for all schools. As part of Safety Week activities, we will conduct practice drills for Fire and Lockdown. Students will review emergency procedures in case of fire, medical emergencies or the need for Lockdown measures. Everyone will be well prepared and the drills will cause minimal disruption. The students had the opportunity to learn about bus safety evacuation procedures from representatives from Stock Transportation last week.



EQAO

Each year, students in Ontario schools who are enrolled in Grades 3, 6 or 9 participate in Provincewide Assessments in Language and Math. Last May our Grade 3 and 6 students spent several blocks of time writing the EQAO Language and Math assessments, which were submitted to the EQAO for scoring. Those students have recently received their individual results. As a school, we have done very well and are pleased to share those results with you.



At HG Bernard the EQAO data are used regularly to guide school improvement initiatives by helping to identify areas of strength and areas needing improvement and by helping to support changes in instructional practices that may be required. The provincial test results can also help schools engage in meaningful discussions about student achievement with their parent community. We all know that parents can and do exert a powerful influence on their children's work habits, behaviour, attitudes toward school and, ultimately, learning and achievement. EQAO is pleased to help strengthen the partnership between home and school by offering a series of resources for parents and educators, available on the agency's Web site, to help school communities engage in the kind of

meaningful, data-based dialogue that supports student success. Of course, EQAO data are only one of the sources of information that should be used to assess student achievement. Provincial testing results should always be considered alongside other school and school board-based information. CLEAN YOUR HANDS TO PREVENT ILLNESS

When done properly, hand washing reduces the risk and spread of illnesses. Parents are encouraged to review the importance of regular washing with their children.

Hands should be washed:

- after coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose
- after using the bathroom
- after shaking hands
- after playing outside or touching garbage
- after touching animals
- before eating and/or preparing food
- before touching your face
- when you or someone you come into contact with is sick

The six steps to proper hand washing are:

- 1. Wet hands with warm running water
- 2. Apply liquid soap
- 3. Lather hands for at least 15 seconds
- 4. Rinse hands back and front
- 5. Dry hands with a paper towel
- 6. Turn water taps off with paper towel

You can support proper hand washing by:

- Reinforcing the hand washing message at home
- Establishing hand washing routines at home
- Being a hand washing role model so children will follow your lead

GENTLE HANDS PROGRAM

Ms. Kieser's Autism Community Class has a new program running in her classroom called Gentle Hands. The Gentle Hands Program is an interactive program that will enhance the students' interpersonal and communication skills through the use of a trained service dog. Ms. Kieser's class was able to experience the trained service dog named Abby on September 21, 2013. The students enjoyed petting, walking, and reading to Abby.



Through this program the students will not only learn responsibility skills, but also work on their social and communication skills. The Gentle Hands Program provides both an emotional and social environment for the students, one that they look forward to participating in with Abby every other week.



BUS LOOP AND STUDENT DROP OFF

This year we have many more students who take busses attending HG Bernard. As a consequence our Bus Loop, and Drop Off Loop has become dangerously congested. Often busses cannot make their way into the Bus Loop. Also, parents and children are often in a hurry and do not see cars, or other children. We have had several 'close calls'. We have invited a team of experts to help us address these safety considerations. Their report will be shared this week. The loop will be closed to all vehicles (except busses) between 8:15 am and 8:35 am, and again in the afternoon between 2:45 and 3:15. There is ample parking at the tennis courts, and there is a safe walkway, away from traffic. Cars can also park on the north side of Bernard Avenue and let children off at the sidewalk. Please avoid making 'u' turns as this

WALKING TO SCHOOL SAFELY

This is a good time for parents to remind their children about pedestrian safety. York Regional Police has provided the following safety tips on their website to help keep students safe on their way to and from school:

- Walk on available sidewalks
- Always cross at intersections
- Obey crossing guards
- Stop before stepping into roadway
- Be visible and indicate crossing intentions
- Look and listen for traffic in all directions
- Make eye contact with drivers
- Cross safely when the roadway is clear
- Walk. Do not run or cycle across roads
- If possible use the buddy system
