Pathways After School Social (P.A.S.S.)

The P.A.S.S. program is a free after school program for Grade 6-8 students with the objective of promoting active and healthy kids in both mind and body. The program includes a variety of physical activities and sports, nutrition and wellness lessons, a daily healthy snack, guest presenters, some reading and homework help, as well as self esteem building activities. The goal of P.A.S.S. is to meet the social, physical and nutritional needs of many of our students during the after school period of their day. The P.A.S.S. program will run for the entire school year on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays after school until 6:00 pm. Spaces for this program are limited and registration sheets were sent home last week. Additional registration packages can be found in the office. If you would like to sign up for the P.A.S.S. program fill out a registration form and hand it into the office. Participants will be accepted on a first come first serve basis after which a waitlist will be created.

Safe Arrival Program

When your child will not be attending school or will be arriving late, please call the Safe Arrival line at 905-508-7009 ext. 2. Please take the time to leave a clear message



that includes your child's first and last name, their grade, the teacher's name and the reason for the absence. It would be appreciated that you make the call as soon as possible, before 8:00 a.m. on the morning that your child will be absent or late. If your child has to leave before 3:00, you must come into the office and sign out your child. Following this procedure helps us ensure your child's safety.

Safety Awareness Week

The York Region District School Board is committed to providing safe learning environments for all students. To support that endeavour, the week of September 30 – October 4, 2013 has been designated YRDSB Safety Awareness Week.

To help prepare our students to evacuate the school quickly and safely, we have planned to practice a fire drill and conduct a practice lockdown drill. In advance of these drills, we will review protocols and expectations during an emergency with all students, staff and affected partners.

In the event of an evacuation, our re-location site is Corpus Christi Catholic Elementary School located at 35 Squire Drive, Richmond Hill, Ontario. Phone: (905) 770-8713. If there is a need to evacuate, Parents/Guardians will be contacted for pickup details.

In the Library ...

Welcome to a new school year! We are ready to begin library exchange! At H. G. Bernard P.S., we encourage all children to borrow books on a regular basis. Books are signed out for two-weeks; renewals are possible if other students are not waiting for the book. Our kindergarten students are encouraged to exchange books each time they come to the library. Books are on loan for two-weeks. Students may borrow:

- 2 books in Grade K-1
- 3 books in Grade 2-3
- 4 books in Grade 4 and up

Book Care

Children should read books away from food and drink. The students are responsible for protecting library books from younger siblings and pets. If books are lost or damaged beyond repair, there will be a charge. All money collected for lost and damaged books will go toward the replacement of the book. The replacement cost for a soft cover book is \$9.00 and a hard cover book is \$17.00. We would much rather have the books so please take care of our books. Should individual issues arise, I will send a note home.



<u>Book Bags</u>

Students from kindergarten through grade three receive book bags. Book bags help protect the books between home and school. Please encourage your student(s) to take care of both the books and the bags.

September in the Library

September's focus in the library will be class orientations. We'll talk about library routines and expectations (an information letter has been sent home). A fall book fair is being planned. I will share more about library initiatives in upcoming newsletters.

Student Busing Eligibility



Did you know that students' busing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:

- All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation

School Organization

Our school organization for this year remains <u>tentative</u>. As you are aware, the Ministry of Education has mandated a hard cap of 20 students in each of the primary (Grade 1-3) classes. Since this is a hard cap, there is little flexibility to increase the limit above 20. Class size will be closely monitored over the next few weeks and is it possible that we may need to reorganize. Any reorganization would occur on the PA day, September 23, and any families/ students affected by the reorganization would be notified prior to that date.

Student Safety - Severe Allergy Alert

Several students at HG Bernard PS have severe allergies to peanuts and other nut products. We need your help to keep our friends safe at all times. Please read labels and ingredients prior to sending



specific items to school. Check the ingredient list for peanut oil, peanut butter, peanut sauce, peanut flour, peanut meal, mixed nuts, ground nuts, goober nuts, goober peas, artificial nuts and mandalona nuts. There are many hidden sources of peanuts/ nuts in foods. Some examples include, cookies, chocolate, granola bars, some cereal bars, and some vegetable oils and shortening.
