All information below can also be found in more detail on the <u>Presentation Slides</u> provided by Ms. Flikas at the Post-Secondary Planning Information Session. The following are brief notes from the presentation:

Graduation Requirements

- 30 Credits (Compulsory & Electives)
- pass the OSSLT
- 40hrs Community Service

<u>The Purpose of a Bachelor Degree</u> (earned at University or College)

- more suited to problem-solving and theoretical understanding of subjects
- requires higher level communication skills (both written and oral)
- understanding the traits of what is the best fit for each individual student

A Diploma or Certificate Program (College)

- more practical application of skills & career-oriented
- preparation for more advanced learning, if desired
- some of the benefits

 the ability to do 2yrs of a Diploma Program at College at at a lesser cost, then apply to a Degree Program in a University stream

Post-Secondary Options

- University Degrees (4-5yrs)
- Degree Programs at College (4 yrs)
- College Diplomas & Advanced Diplomas (2-3 yrs)
- College Certificates (1 yr)

College AND University Options

- College (2-3 yrs) ☐ University (2-3 yrs)
- University (4 yrs) ☐ College Certificate(1 yr)

Apprenticeships

- College preparation is often required to provide appropriate training
- students can go directly into an apprenticeship after high school
- students studying in the Skilled Trades area can start in Grade 11 and Gr 12 ...
 - Semester 2 of Gr 12 □ full day Coop
 - this can count toward Level 1 Apprenticeship ... and it's FREE!

- personal visits to campuses
 - Ms. Flikas strongly encourage students/families to visit campuses of choice before making your choices

University Application: www.ouac,ca

College Application: www.ontariocolleges.ca

- PIN#s were sent ot all Gr12 students in their GAPPS account
- Applications are being accepted from November through to January 16^{th,} 2020 (for University applications) and February 1st, 2020 (for College applications)

Application Costs

- College ☐ \$95 (*up to <u>5 choices</u>*) BUT no more than 3 to any 1 college
- University □ \$150 (*up to <u>3 choices</u>*)
 - o after the first 3, it will be \$50 for each additional choice
 - o no more than 3 choices at any 1 university

Applying for University

- requires a minimum of 6 U or M courses
- all programs require that a student has ENG4U1
- many will expect a Supplemental Applications ☐ this can be written or video, essay, test/exam, audition, interview, letter of reference
 - DO NOT MISS DEADLINES
 - there is no flexibility!
- students with IEPs will receive accommodations at college
 - Psycho-educational Assessments will be done in Gr11 for preparation
 - up to parents to request this and to keep up-to-date with this documentation
 - for those with Behavioural/Medical IEPs $\ \square$ can apply for OSAP in the category of students with a disability

Marks Submissions

- marks are sent electronically to both OUAC & OCAS by Vaughan SS based on the following timelines:
 - Gr11 Marks □ early Oct (for Early Admissions)
 - Semester 1 Final Gr12 Marks ☐ January (initial offers)
 - Semester 2 Mid-Terms Gr12 Marks
 April (next round of offers)
 - Final Gr12 Marks ☐ June (at this time offers can be withdrawn based on final results)
 - Summer submission (including YRDSB summer school results)
 - beware of the "Private School" credits
 - universities are being very selective, and these Private School credits are identifiable on the school transcript and are not always looked on favourably

Mental Health Concerns

- dealing with the rise in the areas of high stress and unmanageable anxiety on the rise with adolescents and young adults
- read the signs of your child when they are away

Applying in Canada outside of Ontario, to the US

• the Common Application was due in October for US & International applications

Advanced Placement Courses

- the AP Exams are ready in July
- Canadian Universities do not consider these credits in the admission process
- US Universities consider these credits more highly in their admission process
- Why AP?
 - some students can use the AP credit to waive their 1st year course in that subject area

<u>Scholarships/Bursaries and other Financial Assistance</u> (will do further presentation in April)

- OSAP has changed under the current provincial gov't □ includes grants & loans
- based on the combined family income; not all families will qualify
- must apply in each year that you are attending
- <u>elimination</u> of the 6 month interest free period after graduation
- an aid estimator is available on the OSAP website to get an idea of money that you might receive
- check out college & university Entrance Scholarships

 these are dependent on admission average

- based on financial needs not academics
- check on the Financial Aid website of each institution
