#### **From the Office**

This year, **National Indigenous History Month** begins during a time when many in Canada are focused on the recent discoveries of a mass grave at a former Residential School in Kamloops British Columbia. Examining the truths of Canada's colonial past is important work and should continue to drive our examination of bias and what Canadian history has tried to keep hidden for so long. The importance, however, of continuing to uplift and affirm Indigenous identities while including positive representations must not be pushed aside in the process.

National Indigenous History month is a time to celebrate the diverse cultures of First Nations, Métis and Inuit communities, as opposed to focusing on what has been done to them. The Canadian Government unanimously declared June as National Indigenous HistoryMonth in 2009 through a motion in the House of Commons. The month, which includes National Indigenous Peoples Day, is a perfect time to reflect upon the long relationship between the many different Indigenous peoples of Turtle Island and Canadians throughout history. For students and teachers, it is a good time to become better acquainted with the different First Peoples who share this land with us.

Holland Landing Public School sits on the traditional territories of the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishinaabe peoples. We know and understand that Indigenous people have always been here, and their presence continues to this day. The Chippewas of Georgina Island First Nation is our closest First Nation community, and our partners in education within the York Region District School Board. We can demonstrate a commitment to understanding truth by learning their stories, understanding their history, and recognizing their presence and contributions to our greater community.

This land is the treaty lands of the First Nations of the Williams Treaty. A treaty is an agreement, and a promise. All of us living on this land are treaty people; we need to make sure we uphold our responsibilities for the land. We need to continue to care for the Earth, our community, our families, and each other.

#### **Pride Month**

June is Pride Month, and YRDSB is recognizing and celebrating Pride Month with a number of initiatives including the opportunity for schools to fly the Pride flag at their school sites. This year, we will raise our Pride flag after the 215 hours of mourning in memory of the 215 Indigenous children whose lives were lost.

Flying the Pride flag:

- demonstrates our commitment to eliminating harmful biases and prejudice that lead to discrimination and exclusion.
- signals our commitment to upholding the principles outlined in the Ontario
  Human Rights Code and the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms which
  reflect the values held by Canadians and Ontarians.
- aligns with the Director's Annual Plan which identifies Equity and Inclusivity as a priority area.



We acknowledge that everyone – government, staff, students, parents and members of the wider community – has an important role to play in creating learning and working environments which are respectful, safer and inclusive.

Students and families have received a link to their respective surveys by email. Families who do not want to participate in the Family Survey may disregard the email invitation.


