

Land Acknowledgement

We affirm that we are all treaty people and acknowledge that the York Region District School Board is located on the lands of two treaties. These treaties have been signed with the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and the First Nations of the Williams Treaties who are: the Mississaugas of Alderville, Curve Lake, Hiawatha, Scugog Island; and the Chippewas of Beausoleil, Rama, and Georgina Island who is our closest neighbour and partner in education.



- Students can make appointments with their counsellor through TeachAssist.
- Parents may make appointments with their son's or daughter's counsellor by calling the Guidance Office.

Accessing Student Success

Student Services / Special Education

- Every child who is Identified will have a SERT assigned to them. This is both your childs and your first point of contact with regards to their IEP and accommodations
- If your child is taking Learning Strategies, the teacher is their SERT. Otherwise their SERT will connect with the student and their parents over the coming weeks
- IEPS completed by mid October. Teachers will see previous IEP until then.
- If you are new to YRDSB, there will be an IPRC scheduled in September / October to finalize. In the interim, accommodations will still be provided.

SEA EQUIPMENT

- If your child has their SEA equipment, please have them bring it to HHSS and go to room 311 to get a new loan agreement.
