
#### **Chamber Choir Performance - June 1st**

# Important Summer School Information

### YRDSB SUMMER SCHOOL

Secondary summer school registration opens April 9 and closes June 7, 2024 (closes June 7 for ACCELERATION only)- if a course that you registered for gets canceled, you will find out soon after June 7

If you know you are planning on registering for a summer school credit, please register ASAP. Waiting to register may result in the course being full. There will be in-person summer school at various locations offering grade 10-12 courses as well as ESL courses. There are also online learning option (asynchronous) for acceleration. Please print the sign off form and bring to guidance ASAP so that we can approve your registration.

ACCELERATION- 4 weeks Taking the course for the first time or a repeat of the course if not recommended for REINFORCEMENT

REINFORCEMENT (CREDIT RECOVERY) - 2 weeks will continue to be open after June 7. Students must be recommended by the teacher as well as the student success team (including the Principal), in order to take REINFORCEMENT.

#### **CREDIT STRENGTHENING**

Students who wish to upgrade their mark in credits they have previously earned. Compulsory courses offered can be found in my Pathway Planner. Students cannot take an acceleration course at the same time.

The hours for all courses (In person and remote) are 8:45 a.m. to 3:33 p.m. with two 15-minute scheduled breaks and a 40-minute lunch period.

- Acceleration courses start Wednesday, July 3 and end Friday, July 26.
- Session 1 for reinforcement courses start Wednesday, July 3 and end Monday, July 15.
- Session 2 for reinforcement courses start Tuesday, July 16 and end Friday, July 26.
- All In-person Acceleration courses are for students under the age of 21 with the exception of Adult Credit English as a Second Language

All Students that signed up must print the sign off sheet and return it with your parents signature to guidance ASAP.

If you have signed up but can no longer go, please remove your registration from myBlueprint and if it is a compulsory credit, make sure that you meet with a guidance counselor so that they can schedule you into the course next year.
