

Indigenous Student Study Centre

In collaboration with Victoria Raymer, Indigenous Student Advisor from the First Nation, Metis and Inuit Education Team for the YRDSB, HHSS is proud to introduce and officially open the school's Indigenous Student Study Centre.

The Indigenous Student Study Centre strives to create a sense of belonging and support for the academic, spiritual, physical, and emotional well-being of a diverse Indigenous student population. The Centre will provide a safe community space that offers culturally appropriate support services and programs to facilitate students' success throughout their secondary studies.

The Indigenous Student Study Centre will be open to students on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Students are provided opportunities such as:

- Culturally specific learning opportunities or activities
- One-on-one support for academic, achievement and well-being
- Access to Indigenous Student Advisors
- Support for transitions to post-secondary education pathways

Academic Support

- Learning Skills and Career supports
- Advice and Referrals
- Writing Instruction

Spiritual Support

- Access to Elders/Traditional Knowledge Keepers
- Learning Skills and Career supports
- Advice and Referrals

Cultural Support

- Cultural Workshops include beading, moccasin, ribbon skirt, hand drum making, etc.
- Access to traditional medicines
- To provide opportunities for positive interactions between FNMI People and the community at large.
- Connection to Indigenous organizations outside of YRDSB

Loitering in the Washrooms

As a school community we are currently dealing with students who are loitering in the washrooms. Students have reported feeling unsafe entering the washrooms due to the actions of a few. In some cases this has resulted in some students leaving school to access the washrooms of restaurants nearby. No student should ever be made to feel unsafe or unwanted simply for wanting access to a basic human right. In addition to the safety concerns these gatherings impose, we know that when groups of students gather in the washrooms other activities such as vaping and vandalism may occur. When acts of vandalism occur, the washrooms must be closed in order to ensure that health and safety standards are being met.


Staff are responding to these issues and are entering the 'public spaces' of the washrooms to move student onto their classes or to other acceptable spaces in the building, such as the cafeteria. We are also making regular announcements reminding students that the washrooms are not gathering spaces. Students who are repeatedly loitering are being directed to the main office and phone calls home to families are made. Our next steps in progressive discipline will be to issue detentions. Persistent unacceptable behaviour and opposition to authority may lead to a suspension. This is not something we want to do, as we want to have students in school and learning. However we cannot let the actions of a few, have a negative impact on the overall moral tone of the Huron Community.

Finally we ask that you talk to your teen about vaping. Students are not permitted to vape on school property, or within 20 meters of the school boundary. Not only is vaping illegal under the Smoke Free Ontario act, it is extremely unhealthy. When students are caught vaping, we will speak with them and contact families. Tobacco Enforcement is notified and fines will be administered. A summons to attend court will be issued for any person under the age of 16.
