Orange Shirt Day

Orange Shirt Day is an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.

It grew out of <u>*Phyllis' story*</u> of having her shiny new orange shirt taken away on her first day of school at the St. Joseph's Mission Residential School in Williams Lake, BC. September 30th was chosen because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential schools.

On <u>Friday, September 29th</u> we encourage all students and staff to wear an orange shirt to honour Residential School Survivors. We will remember the past and work towards creating a better future.

Interim Reports

In Semester One, families will receive three reports including the Interim Report, Mid-Semester Report and Semester End Report. Our reports provide you information about your child's achievement throughout the first semester. Interim reports are part of the ongoing communication from our school to support student achievement and well-being. We hope that this report will provide valuable feedback for your child while supporting conversations about learning at home. Distribution of your child's interim report card for the first semester will begin on October 16. These reports will be distributed using the same process used for Mid-Semester and Final Reports via student GAPPS accounts. Also, more information on 'Meet the Teacher Night' on October 26 will be shared with families via email.

Safety Week

The York Region School Board is committed to ensuring the safety of students, staff, building occupants and visitors in the event of an emergency situation. As such, during Safety Week (September 25 to 29, 2023) and throughout the school year, schools in our Board practise various safety drills including Fire Drills, Lockdown Drills, Hold and Secure Drills and the newly established Bomb Threat Drill. Loitering in the Washrooms


As a school community we are currently dealing with students who are loitering in the washrooms. Students have reported feeling unsafe entering the washrooms due to the actions of a few. In some cases this has resulted in some students leaving school to access the washrooms of restaurants nearby. No student should ever be made to feel unsafe or unwanted simply for wanting access to a basic human right. In addition to the safety concerns these gatherings impose, we know that when groups of students gather in the washrooms other activities such as vaping and vandalism may occur. When acts of vandalism occur, the washrooms must be closed in order to ensure that health and safety standards are being met.

Staff are responding to these issues and are entering the 'public spaces' of the washrooms to move student onto their classes or to other acceptable spaces in the building, such as the cafeteria. We are also making regular announcements reminding students that the washrooms are not gathering spaces. Students who are repeatedly loitering are being directed to the main office and phone calls home to families are made. Our next steps in progressive discipline will be to issue detentions. Persistent unacceptable behaviour and opposition to authority may lead to a suspension. This is not something we want to do, as we want to have students in school and learning. However we cannot let the actions of a few, have a negative impact on the overall moral tone of the Huron Community.

Finally we ask that you talk to your teen about vaping. Students are not permitted to vape on school property, or within 20 meters of the school boundary. Not only is vaping illegal under the Smoke Free Ontario act, it is extremely unhealthy. When students are caught vaping, we will speak with them and contact families. Tobacco Enforcement is notified and fines will be administered. A summons to attend court will be issued for any person under the age of 16. Health Care Plans

Health care plans are created for students who are at known risk for specific medical emergencies due to **diabetes**, **asthma**, **anaphylactic allergies** and/or **diabetes** or who may require daily medical routine management that at school. If your child has **diabetes**, **asthma**, **anaphylactic allergies**, **diabetes** or any other condition, all necessary forms can be found on our <u>website</u> or if you would prefer an electronic form, please contact the main office.

Once you've completed the appropriate Health Care Plan, please return it to the main office WITH the appropriate medication to school with your child. The form and medication can be placed in a sealable bag, with the student name marked on the bag and left at the office.


