

Health Care Plans

Health care plans are created for students who are at known risk for specific medical emergencies due to diabetes, asthma, anaphylactic allergies and/or diabetes or who may require daily medical routine management that at school. These plans inform staff of the necessary steps to keep your child safe. If your child has diabetes, asthma, anaphylactic allergies, diabetes or any other condition, all necessary forms can be found on our website or if you would prefer an electronic form, please contact the main office.

Once you've completed the appropriate Health Care Plan, please return it to the main office WITH the appropriate medication to school with your child. The form and medication can be placed in a sealable bag, with the student name marked on the bag and left at the office.

Self-screening

Students/attendees, staff and visitors should continue to complete the provincial <u>COVID-19 school and child care screening tool</u> every day before attending school. Symptomatic individuals and their household members should follow the instructions on the screening tool for isolation requirements; parents should not send children to school or child care if they show any symptoms of COVID-19.

Anaphylaxis

We have students and staff in our school who have food and scent allergies. If some of these students or staff smell or come into contact with certain foods or scents, they may go into "anaphylactic shock" - a potentially life-threatening condition. To ensure the health and safety of all of our students, please let the school know if your child has a life-threatening allergy. We also encourage that all nut and nut products remain at home.

Caring and Safe School Presentations - September 15th to September 18th

YRDSB is committed to creating and maintaining caring and safe environments where students, staff, families and others feel safe at school and at all school-related events and activities. The Caring and Safe Schools student start-up presentations are a way to establish such environments at the start of the school year. Indigenous Languages and International Languages (ILIL) Program

The York Region District School Board offers language learning to elementary students in Senior Kindergarten to Grade 8 and language credit courses to secondary students in Grades 9 to 12.

Elementary Language Classes

Elementary classes are extra-curricular language learning opportunities available in-person or remotely. Classes are 2.5 hours and take place once per week between Tuesday to Friday evenings (6:00 PM to 8:30 PM) or Saturday mornings (9:30 AM to 12:00 PM).

Register by Monday, September 11, 2023 to attend the full language program in its entirety.



BOOKING A GUIDANCE APPOINTMENT

Your Guidance Department is available to help support you and answer questions.

- Appointments will be booked on TeachAssist. You will see each counsellor's schedule of available time slots at the top of your TeachAssist account when you log on.
- STARTING THE YEAR- Appointment slots will become available as of September 17th (or after we complete course selections). If you currently have an appointment booked with your counsellor, please make sure you have filled out the google form that was emailed to you along with your timetable and we will call you in your class. It is important that you follow your current timetable so that we are able to locate you. THE DEADLINE TO FILL OUT THE COURSE CHANGE FORM IS MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 11 @ 4pm
- Time slots are 15 minutes each but if you feel you may require a longer time period (eg., Planning for Post-Secondary) then book two consecutive spots. If you are in class at the time of your booked appointment, please let your teacher know at the beginning of the class that you have an appointment.
- Counsellors will meet with you in-person in the Guidance office or send you a Google Meet invitation for your appointment if you are a student currently learning remotely.
