#### Inclusion Activity: Learning Skills and Work Habits - Mirella Sanwalka

- <u>from Growing Success document</u>: in pairs, open envelope, match description with the Learning Skills and Work Habits
- learning skill levels based on observational and conversational data what teachers see and what they get from talking to students; students can do self-evaluations; teachers track, but not for marks, more in terms of moving levels
- <u>full disclosure date</u> marks will show up on transcript after this date; grade 12 students would need to drop courses before that date to avoid low marks appearing on transcripts





#### Modern Learning and Math – Mirella Sanwalka

- Math help at home: https://homeworkhelp.ilc.org/
- students register for free on the website; can pick a tutor, view interactive tutorials, click on sample solutions
- viewed a sample video session with a tutor speaking and demonstrating how to graph a relation using slope and y-intercept
- viewed an interactive tutorial on the xy-plane
- can store past sessions in a personal file entitled "My Locker"
- very comprehensive site for math assistance

#### School Plan: Monitoring our Progress – Mirella Sanwalka

#### MOBYSS Bus – Mirella Sanwalka

- free mobile clinic that comes weekly (on Tuesdays); no health card needed
- service for students who don't have access to a family doctor can get support via this service
- make appointment through Guidance and get slips
- advertised through announcements and posters
- to access Mental Health Nurse a referral is needed

- structure parent e-bulletin so that it's not so repetitive, and give the important information at the beginning of the bulletin
