Why College?

- focus on student's professional and academic growth.
- universities offer a wide range of course options to students.
- Potential for increased earning potential.
- having a degree can possibly give you better access to more of the job market.
- being part of an environment that fosters competitiveness, creative thinking, innovation

Make sure you apply for the right program!

Terminology

Undergraduate Degree: This is the first degree you will complete at university

Post Graduate Degree: This is a program that requires you to have some college or university requirements

Bachelor Degree: This is the type of undergraduate degree:

Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Business etc..

Degree: 3-4 years of university program (some offered at college)

Diploma: College 2-3 years

Certificate: 1 -2 years at college

What courses do I need to apply?

College

- High School diploma required
- Grade 12 College English (ENG4C) or University English (ENG4U)plus requirements for the program you apply to - that is the average - one class or 2 etc.
- Be aware of additional requirements for highly competitive programs: (i.e. Portfolio, Audition, etc.)
- Highly Competitive Programs, also check the <u>College Dialogue .pdf</u> for information on Oversubscribed programs

University

- High school diploma required.
- Minimum overall averages for each program are on My pathway planner (vary for schools)
- SIX Gr. 12 "U" or "U/C" (M) courses
- English 4U is a MUST for almost all programs. (Included in the SIX 4U's/M's).
- Plus what other prerequisites are listed for your Post Secondary program.
- Check for courses with the same first 5 characters—Universities do not recognize these as different courses (e.g. <u>TDJ4M</u>2, <u>TDJ4M</u>3)
- Check the <u>University Dialogue</u>. <u>pdf</u> for information on how gr 11 marks are treated, repeated courses, transitions, tours etc.,





New Account Process For OUAC!!!

CREATE
YOUR OWN
ACCOUNT

The OUAC processes applications to undergraduate programs and professional programs, like law, medicine, rehabilitation sciences and teacher education.



What Information will I need to Apply?

- OEN
- School Mident Number
- Appropriate Email Address (do not use your GAPPS)- Make sure you check junk!
- Use your full legal name to ensure there is no issues

Where can you find your Ontario Education Number?

If you are applying to Post Secondary in Ontario for either College or University you will need your OEN.

This can be found:

- On any Ontario Provincial Report Card
- Also sent in an email the week of Oct 10 to your GAPPS account

Application Fees

College

- The <u>application processing fee</u> for programs starting after Aug 2025 is \$150 (Non-refundable)
- You may choose up to 5 program choices, with no more than 3 at the same college
- Visa, MasterCard, Amex via online or phone. Money orders also accepted
- Application is not processed until fee is paid

University

- Ontario University Application Centre requires a fee of \$156.00 to accompany the application.
- The application allows for 3 choices for the \$156 fee.
- Any university choices beyond 3 requires an additional \$50.00 per choice.
- Some have additional supplementary fees
- Visa, MasterCard, Amex, online banking (OUAC will give you acct #)
- Application not processed until you PAY

**Note that dates and Costs in this video are not up to date in this video but the process is accurate.

Check, Read, Check!

Once you have applied check:

- Every school will be sending you information to set up an <u>account specific</u> to their school
- that your marks are correct- WE SEND THEM to OUAC & OCAS and many out of province universities request your marks from OUAC
- if you have to do <u>supplementary application</u>
- if you need portfolio/audition
- CHECK YOUR EMAIL SO YOU DON'T MISS ANYTHING!

Let's Talk Offers

- Early offers not early acceptance
- Offers are not guaranteed they give you an offer and give conditions - read these conditions and keep average up.. it is final marks for both semesters that count.
- Rolling Offers vs. Specific Offer Times
- Rounds of Offers -grade 11 marks before mid terms 90+
 - Midterms(sem 1 + grade 11's to equal 6 courses)
 - final marks for sem 1
 - o midterms sem 2 MOST offers go out (all gr. 12)

Accepting Your Offer

Your offers will come appear on OUAC & OCAS and also directly from school.

Accept on OUAC & OCAS

Life of a File: How a Student's File is Created and Becomes a Completed Application



Grades Held in OUAC's

System
Grades sent before a student completes their application will be held and matched once the student submits.

Demographic File

High schools send information on all university-bound students (e.g., academic records, basic demographics).

November Grades

High schools send all first-semester midterm grades for 4U/M courses to the OUAC.

February Grades

High schools send final first-semester grades and current full-year grades to the OUAC.

April Grades

High schools send updated full-year course grades and midterm grades for second semester to the OUAC.

July Grades

High schools send final grades for second semester and full-year courses to the OUAC.

Undergrad Application

Applicants create an OUAC account, complete their application, and receive an OUAC Reference Number.

Completed Application

The applicant pays for their application and the OUAC reviews it.

Grades are auto-matched and appear in the application.

Application Sent

The OUAC sends applications to the universities daily.

Grades Transmitted

The OUAC transmits grades to the universities daily.



Applicant

Responding to Offers

Applicants can accept, decline or cancel acceptances from their application.

Offers of Admission

The universities notify the applicants of offers.



Common Questions

Alternate Offers - some schools yes - depends on reason and some depends on average

Deferrals - some -can't be at any school while waiting - always apply- might not know until August

Ranking - most doesn't matter

Night school/ Summer - most OK - University of Waterloo asks why

Supplementary Application - all vary for both College & University

Residence - Not all are guaranteed. Double Check. Type of Room?

Prices VARY depending on room type

Extenuating Circumstances - Varies by School

Important Dates

College

- Offers can start as early as November 1, 2024
- May 1, 2025: Deadline to
 Confirm Offers of Admission

OCAS Schedule of Important
Dates

University

- May 29, 2025 Latest date to receive a response from universities(a refusal too)
- June 1, 2025- Confirmation of acceptance must be made to university and earliest date universities can ask for financial commitment

OUAC Schedule of Important Dates

Semester I Only

Those students who will leave after Sem 1:

- You must be responsible for your own application.
- Check in periodically with Guidance for Graduation information
- ILC/Private school courses will not be added automatically. You can ask private schools to inform OUAC and OCAS
 - Our upload will only send a private school course once it has been completed and we have entered it into our system
- Night/Summer School Courses make sure these are added to your OUAC application

APPLYING TO OTHER CANADIAN PROVINCES

- Deadlines will be different
- Applications will be completed online on the individual school websites as "out of province" applications (not on OUAC)
- Some Universities electronically receive your grades through your OUAC Ref. #. Check into this.
- Otherwise, Guidance will need to send your transcripts
- Make an appointment in Guidance for assistance
- You need to take responsibility for researching the info including

APPLYING TO SCHOOLS IN THE USA

- U.S. schools consider grades 9-12
- SAT or ACT entrance exams** -many schools aren't requiring (check <u>fairtest.org</u>)
- Many U.S. universities use the "Common Application"
- Any student applying to the U.S. <u>must connect with a counsellor in Guidance early in the school year</u> to complete the school portion of your application and regularly send transcripts electronically
- Tuition may be significantly higher (US\$)
- Take personal responsibility. Do your research.

Post Secondary Information Sessions

Make sure you are attending the various guidance sessions that will be offered throughout the year topics include:

- Apprenticeship Pathways (Oct- Nov)
- How to Finance Post Secondary (Jan-Feb)
- Accepting your Offer /Grad/Prom info (April)

Students with an IEP

Students with IEPs CAN receive accommodations in college and university

It is the <u>student's responsibility</u> to make an appt with Student Services once you receive your offer and activate the support. They will not know that you have an IEP otherwise.

See them *well before* your program starts. Ask about what documentation will be needed.

When you need a reference letter...

If you require a reference letter for a scholarship or bursary, you must:

- Make the request at least 2 weeks in advance to allow teachers time to write the reference.
- Provide the name of the award, institution and criteria for the award.
- Provide a copy of an updated resume.

SCHOLARSHIPS / AWARDS AT HURON

Alex and Cathie MacKay Endowment Trust Fund

- A graduating student continuing their education in a Canadian College or University
- Student has financial need
- 70% overall average in their best eight senior courses
- Community Involvement

Entrance Scholarships-

80% 85% 90% 95% - every school gives different amounts - must use prerequisites - get this just by applying. The amount they give is usually over the amount of time that you are there



Your Semester I marks are being sent to OCAS and OUAC

FACT

Don't worry! Institutions are only using these marks for early acceptance. More on that later....



Early Offers of Admission are important.

MYTH

Early offers of admission can take off the pressure. This can be hazardous to your motivation if you are not careful. The bulk of all offers wait until the February to April time frame. Later offers are more common for more competitive programs.



Poor Grade 11 grades will cause colleges and universities to reject your application.

MYTH

Grade 11 grades, if good, will often mean an earlier offer of admission but will not be held against you. Institutions will wait to see your grade 12 grades.



If you get a conditional offer in February or April (when most acceptances happen), you must maintain your average to keep your spot and get a final offer.

FACT

You must keep up your average and do not drop or change your classes unless you speak with a counsellor. Your **CONDITIONAL** offer was based on your marks and courses at the time you were accepted. If your grades fall below the required marks, they can cancel/remove the offer.



Better to have all U level courses and no M level courses in your top 6.

MYTH

Universities want a total of 6 courses that can be any combination of U or M as long as prerequisites are met. Some Programs do say minimum number of *U* courses

M level courses are equivalent to U when applying.



When applying to colleges, you will get and adjusted average (differential) if you have U or credits MYTH

A mark is a Mark. Whether you took 12U or 12C English, the mark will be treated the same by the college.

Check the Regional Dialogue



Night School and Summer School and Repeated are frowned upon by colleges & universities.

MYTH

Summer school and Night school are fine, especially if they are taken through a public Board of Education. For some universities/programs you might need to provide an explanation regarding why you chose to take the course outside of day school.

Check the individual schools on how they approach repeated courses.



If you miss the deadline for applying to Ontario Colleges or Universities, you have lost all opportunities to go to school in September. MYTH

By applying by the deadline, you will be given EQUAL CONSIDERATION. That is, your application will be considered with all the others who apply by the deadline. If you apply AFTER the deadline, your application will only be considered after institutions have looked at everyone else's...but it will be considered if there are spots available.

Also, in May, after conditional acceptances have been distributed, OUAC ad OCAS posts programs that still have spots available and you can apply to those programs (check that you meet the requirements)
