Aiming to be an Ontario Scholar? **YOU MUST HAVE 6 Grade**12 credits (any pathway) with aggregate of 480 (average of 80%)

External Credits

If you are taking courses outside of regular day school i.e. Private School, other board, etc. please make sure that you have notified guidance and that the school is willing to send your report card to us in order for it to be put on your transcript.

34 Credit Threshold

- After graduation you can return to Huron for up to 34 Credits. Repeat credits count in this total.
- You can go over before the 4 years are up but that means you are not returning for day school.
- Students with an IEP & ESL Language Courses 34 credit threshold does not apply.
- Remember the courses that you want might not be offered in semester I of next year.
- Online/night/adult courses are available.
- □ Returning students MUST have min 3 courses

When you do decide...

CHECK YOUR COURSE CODES!!

- For university you need 6 GRADE 12 U or M type courses (4U not 3U [gr.11])
- College Diploma requires Grade 12 College English <u>ENG4C</u> (plus other requirements), *can not use OLC4O or ENG4E
- Outside of Ontario you MUST check with the schools you are applying to

If you are applying outside of Ontario, please make sure you connect with your guidance counsellor

Consider the Following

What school has my program? Do I have the prerequisites? (these may vary) Prerequisites vs. Recommended Courses? What marks are they asking for? Do they have a co-op? (based on 1st Year?) What are the tuition fees? (schools vary) ■ What are the residence options? Which campus will this program be at? Plan Soul Search... Research What are your passions? ■ What are your strengths? What kind of student are you? (will college or university be better for your learning style?)

Make sure you apply for the right program!

Terminology

Undergraduate Degree: This is the first degree you will complete at university

Post Graduate Degree: This is a program that requires you to have some college or university requirements

Bachelor Degree: This is the type of undergraduate degree:

Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Business etc..

Degree: 3-4 years of university program (some offered at college)

Diploma: College 2-3 years

Certificate: 1 -2 years at college

Consider the Following

One or more of the following may also be required:

- Supplementary Application
- Essay
- □ Test/Exam
- □ Audition/Portfolio
- □ Interview

Prerequisites

English counts in your average for almost all programs.

<u>College Acceptance</u> - usually based on **Grade 12 College English mark** and that you have graduated. Some programs have other prerequisites/requirements and minimum mark averages

<u>University Acceptance</u> - based on 6 grade 12 U or M courses - including program prerequisites which most require ENG4U

Semester One and Two Midterm and Final marks are sent by Huron to the application center/universities.

Early Offers - You don't apply for early acceptance, it is an offer given, before your second semester midterm marks. Universities **may** use your **grade 11 U and M** courses combined with your semester one grade 12 courses to estimate an average of your 6 U/M classes.

Colleges may start offering acceptances Nov 1 based on grade 11 marks but you still need to produce the grade 12 marks!

Schools have programs that calculate averages you don't have to pick your top 6 grade 12 Marks.



Release of Information to OCAS/OUAC

"There will be a one-time release of grades and other identifying information for all students in Grade 12 in early October.... using secure transmission technology to the Ontario University Application Centre and the Ontario College Application Service in support and in anticipation of all post secondary applications. If you would like more information about this, please contact your assigned guidance counsellor."

Students with an IEP

Students with IEPs CAN receive accommodations in college and university

It is the student's responsibility to make an appt with Student Services once you receive your offer and activate the support. They will not know that you have an IEP otherwise.

See them *well before* your program starts. Ask about what documentation will be needed.

Full Disclosure Date- Semester 1 November 29

Drop a course that you do not want appearing on your transcript

YOU MUST DROP THE COURSE PRIOR TO THIS DATE

****Remember no Part Time status until November (MUST BE ATTENDING 3 COURSES) and even then <u>it must be approved</u> ****

****usually for extenuating circumstances or medical reasons

Keep yourself in the loop!

to announcements, or check the announcement board

CHECK

the boards outside of guidance and on the google classroom

TALK

to your counsellor

CONSULT

the proper websites regularly

ATTEND

our information sessions on how to apply

APPLY

early - do not leave until the absolute deadline
