S.T.E.M.-Related Course Group and Tech Requirement

Compulsory STEM-related course group

Of the 17 compulsory credits, you must complete **ONE** from the following group:

- Business studies
- Computer studies (grade 10)
- Cooperative education
- Mathematics (in addition to the 3 compulsory credits currently required)
- Science (in addition to the 2 compulsory credits currently required)
- Technological education (in addition to the 1 compulsory credit required)

Compulsory Tech course in either grade 9 or 10

Huron has the largest Tech department with the most variety.

All grade 9 Tech courses (except Aesthetics TXJ1O) are HALF CREDIT courses - you get to try out TWO in one semester!

- 11 optional credits •
- 40 hours of community involvement activities
- The provincial literacy requirement
- Earn at least two credits through Online Learning ****
- A maximum of 3 credits in English as a Second Language (ESL) or English Literacy Development (ELD) may be counted toward the 4 compulsory credits in English. The fourth credit must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.
- ** In Groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a Second Language can count as compulsory credits, one from Group 1 and one from either Group 2 or Group 3.
- *** A maximum of 2 credits in Cooperative Education can count as compulsory credits.
- *** Cooperative Education can qualify as one French Immersion credit if students are working with a French speaking community partner in a two credit Co-op program.
- Families who wish to opt out their child from the Online Learning graduation requirement should speak to their child's school. Graduation requirement should indicate this choice through the Course Selection on "My Pathway Planner:"
- The 11 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved Dual Credit courses.
- Students' achieving an OSSD Red Seal Specialist High Skill Major (SHSM) diploma will have additional requirements based on their particular program.
- In addition to the compulsory Technological Education credit in Grade 9 or 10.

Online Learning

2 Credits must be Online Learning

- Students must earn at least **TWO** online learning credits to get their
 Ontario Secondary School Diploma.
- You wouldn't be expected to take an online course until grade 11
- These courses are completely asynchronous, meaning there is no teacher instruction.
- Opting out of the requirement is also possible.

Literacy Test (OSSLT)

Successful completion of the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test

- Administered twice during your Grade 10 year
- If the standard is not met in the first attempt, schools will provide support; test is re-administered until student successfully completes the test or the Grade 12 Literacy Course (OLC4O1)

NEW- Financial Literacy Requirement



Successful completion of the Ontario Secondary School Financial Literacy Requirement New for **September 2025-2026** school year, in your Grade 10 Mathematics course you will write a financial literacy assessment.

- financial literacy graduation requirement as part of your compulsory Grade 10 mathematics course.
- You will need to achieve a mark of 70% or higher to pass




Bring Your Own Device

Overview of Program:


- A 1:1 Program is a teaching and learning environment in which each participating student and teacher
 has access to a personal computing device on a direct and continuous base for educational purposes.
- Students do not share their technology with other students but take ownership over their own device.

Programs include: Dance, Music, Theatre and Visual Arts










Arts Huron Program
