

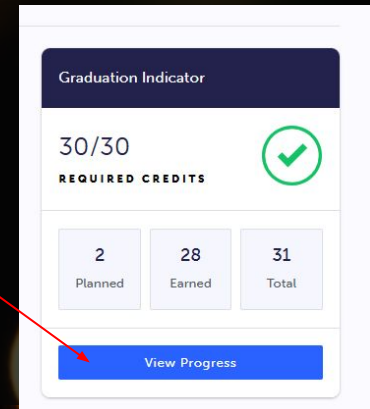
Graduation Reminders From Guidance

Review of GRAD REQUIREMENTS AND CERTIFICATE INFO was disseminated FEB 19 in [THIS PRESENTATION](#)

- [Social Justice Application](#) - Final Year- Application opens May 1
- **40 hours of Community Hours Due: May 1st**
- Please get them into the Guidance Office ASAP -[online applications](#) must be printed and signed by supervisor with contact information

- You must complete an online course OR Opt Out (on your Course Selections or a paper copy from Guidance) in order to graduate
- Double check your credit count and that all of your COMPULSORY COURSES have been completed. Look at the Grad Tracker on **myBlueprint**. If something doesn't seem right, make a guidance appointment.



- FINISH STRONG and make sure you have all your prerequisites- all Post- Secondary offers are conditional.
- GRADE BUMPS WILL NOT HAPPEN AFTER MARKS HAVE BEEN ENTERED!!!! Be in class and doing the work when it is asked of you!



Ontario Scholar

- Six Grade 12 courses any pathway - average 80%
- Dual Credits & Co-op Count (as long as coop is linked to a grade 12 course)--but **not** for U entrance
- Unlike Honour Roll, credits earned outside of Huron Heights also count toward Ontario Scholar designation.

OCAS/OUAC Upload & Full Disclosure Dates

OUAC/OCAS Upload- Morning of Thursday, April 24, 2025

Students must OFFICIALLY (with the right paperwork) drop a course that they do not want to be sent to OUAC/OCAS by

end of day April 23, 2025

Full Disclosure Day- Tuesday, May 6, 2025

Students will have until this date to drop a course without a mark appearing on their transcripts.

Accepting Post- Secondary Offers

- You must go to OCAS or OUAC to accept (for Ontario Schools)
- If you accepted one offer and change your mind then you can accept the new offer. Your other offer will become void.
- Due Dates to Accept:
- OCAS - May 1, 2025 (Earliest Payment June 1)
- OUAC - June 2, 2025 Confirmation of acceptance must be made to university and earliest date universities can ask for financial commitment

Read your emails from the Institutions for Dates of expiry of offers - and financial commitment

- Deferrals require special permission with reason (cannot attend another post secondary school) - one of the reasons you can only accept one offer!
- Make a Guidance appointment if you would like support with next steps

Credit Strengthening Summer

- ❑ 2 weeks in summer to upgrade a course that you have passed.
- ❑ This can be helpful for situations where you might need a certain grade for entry into a program, or to help increase your knowledge for the next grade level
- ❑ **You will need to contact the post secondary institution to ask if they will hold your place until the course is over**
- ❑ Summer School applications opened April 15. Credit Strengthening options should be posted by the end of this week
- ❑ Acceleration options available

GUESTS

A guest is someone who is either a Huron student who is NOT in Grade 12 or a person who does not attend Huron.

- **Guest Forms** will be available at the attendance window beginning **Thursday, April 17th. Must be submitted by Thursday, May 15, 2025**
- Forms **MUST** be filled out completely by Guest, Parent/Guardian (under age 18) AND their school Admin and handed to Ms. Wiltshire at the Attendance window with Photo ID and \$110.00 attached (by cash or cheque only)
- Incomplete forms will not be accepted and tickets will not be reserved
- Admin will review the form and confirm approval

GUESTS

- Must be 21 or under
- Must agree to same conditions as a Huron student
- Agree to Huron Heights contacting their current school/parents/guardians/reference/workplace
- Must provide proof of identity with official photo ID (student card/drivers license...)
- Both sides of the guest form must be completed (photo ID and money must be attached)

Pre and Post Prom Events

- **The administration and staff of Huron Heights Secondary School have not organized nor does it sanction any before or after Prom activities/events.**
- **Students are reminded to make responsible choices and encourage their peers to do the same. Making an unwise decision can ruin your special evening and your future.**

- being under the influence and/or in possession of alcohol or illegal substances is not permitted at York Region District School Board events
- all Board policies and procedures apply to all activities associated with the Prom
- leave the event without compensation if either you or your guest is asked to leave or has to leave for any reason
- you may not be granted admission if friends traveling in the same limo/vehicle are under the influence or if drugs/alcohol are found

If you attend Prom, you agree to...

Student Contract

- respect all those in attendance, and follow the direction of supervisors
- not be under the influence or in possession of drugs and/or alcohol
- display the contents of bags/purses/jackets/personal belongings as a condition of entry
- the confiscation of any inappropriate items as identified by supervisors
- make arrangements to be picked up by 9:00 p.m., the end of the prom

RESPONSIBILITIES

Tips From York Regional Police

- Do not drink alcohol or use drugs and drive
- Do not enter a vehicle with a driver who is under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- Have some extra money in case of emergency
- Make sure a trusted adult is available should you require assistance for any reason
- Make sure you have a cell phone with a fully-charged battery
- If possible, utilize alternative means of transportation such as public transit, taxis, limousines or get a ride from a responsible adult
- If operating a motor vehicle, try to anticipate the actions of other drivers. Driving defensively is something that should be practiced at all time
