

- All incoming Grade 9 students will be required to bring in their own wifi enabled device (i.e Chromebook, Laptop) to use as part of an enhanced blended learning environment.

- One of the biggest benefits is the ability to connect student learning with real world applications.




 PURPOSE: To improve student learning and engagement and to teach students how to be critical thinking CREATORS with technology rather than passive CONSUMERS of technology.





Every course in an Ontario Secondary School has a six-character course code. A code can be broken down as follows:



O = Open


E = Workplace

ACADEMIC	 Offered in the following compulsory courses: Science, Math (gr.10), French, Geography, History (Grade 10) Maximum class size of 29 				
OPEN	 Offered in the following compulsory courses: Physical Education, Arts, Civics/Careers and all remaining grade 9&10 electives Maximum class size of 28 (exception Technology courses 22) 				
LOCALLY DEVELOPED	 May be offered in the following compulsory courses: Science, Math, English, Geography and History (Grade 10) Maximum class size of 16 Placement determined through an IPRC meeting 				

Grade 9 Compulsory Courses



Grade 9 French

- Students require one French credit to graduate
- If a student has an IEP and has completed French instruction in elementary school, they must Grade 9 Academic French
- Students who have not been enrolled in regular French instruction in elementary school or have fewer than 600 hours of French instruction, may wish to complete the beginner French course – FSF101
- A student who is new to Canada may also qualify to study FSF101 (no prior French instruction)
- If students are in Learning Strategies and the Arts Huron Program, then these students may choose to take French/Physical Education/Geography in their Grade 10 year.

Grade 9 Optional Courses

All other selections for Grade 9 will be from the Open type courses. The electives to choose from vary from school to school. The following departments offer courses for Grade 9 students:

Note: Elective courses are often at the Open pathway in grade 9 & 10 however in grade 11 and 12 pathways include College and University courses.

The Grade 10 Literacy Test

A Diploma requirement. Typically administered during your grade 10 year



- ➤A test based on language and communication (reading and writing) expectations of curricula up to and including grade 9
- Accommodations, deferrals and exemptions may be appropriate for some students
- If the standard is not met in the first attempt, schools will provide support; test is re-administered until student successfully completes the test or the Grade 12 Literacy Course

Community Involvement

- ➤ A diploma requirement
- Encourages civic responsibility, promotes community values and reinforces importance of volunteerism
- Complete 40 hours before graduation
- Can start in summer of grade 8
- > Must obtain approval before starting involvement
- > Student responsibility to keep record of activities
- Guidelines and forms will be provided to help track community involvement
- A great way to explore career interests





New Online Graduation Requirements

Students must earn at least two online learning credits to get their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. **These courses are completely asynchronous, meaning there is** *no* **teacher instruction.**

Opting Out

Students may opt out of the online learning graduation requirement during course selection time through My Pathway Planner (myBlueprint). Alternatively, parents who wish to opt out or exempt their child from the online graduation requirement may complete the opt out form available from their child's school.

Mandatory high school graduation requirement will empower students with early exposure to technological education and skilled trades



MISSISSAUGA —The Ontario government is implementing a new high school graduation requirement to help better prepare students across our province for the jobs of tomorrow. Starting with students entering Grade 9 in September 2024, all students will now be required to earn a Grade 9 or 10 Technological Education credit as part of their Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

Students Currently Attending a Non-YRDSB Elementary School (i.e. private school, Catholic Board, home schooled):

Registration paperwork and course selections:

- typically due at the beginning of February exact date still to be determined by the school Board please monitor the Huron website for updated information

Transfer requests:

- required for students living outside our boundaries Check Board website School Locator to determine home school
- If HHSS is not your home school a transfer form will also be due at the time of submitting registration documents Bussing is **not** provided for transfer students

Important to engage in early conversations with Gr 8 teachers if you are unsure about the appropriate course types to select.
