18 Compulsory Credits

- 4 credits in **English** (1 credit per grade)
- 1 credit in **French** as a second language
- 3 credits in **Mathematics** (at least 1 in Gr. 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in **Science**
- 1 credit in Canadian **History**
- 1 credit in Canadian **Geography**
- 1 credit in the **Arts** (music, visual arts, drama, dance)
- 1 credit in health and Physical Education
- .5 credit in civics & .5 credit in Career Studies (grade 10)

How many Elective Credits and how many Compulsory credits?

Grade 9 French

- Students require one French credit to graduate
- If a student has an IEP and has completed French instruction in elementary school, they must Grade 9 Academic French
- •Students who have not been enrolled in regular French instruction in elementary school or have fewer than 600 hours of French instruction, may wish to complete the beginner French course FSF1O1
- •A student who is new to Canada may also qualify to study FSF1O1 (no prior French instruction)
- •If students are in Learning Strategies and the Arts Huron Program, then these students may choose to take French/Physical Education/Geography in their Grade 10 year

New Graduation Requirement

Online Learning Graduation Requirement

Students must earn at least two online learning credits to get their Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

Opting Out

Parents who wish to opt out or exempt their child from the online graduation requirement must complete the opt-out form available from their child's school board. Exemption from the online learning graduation requirements may be requested by:

- the parent or guardian of the secondary student
- students who are 18 years of age or older

34 Credit Threshold

- With appropriate planning and supports, the majority of Ontario students will finish secondary school, graduate and make the transition to their next step in four years
- Students may take as many courses as they wish within the first four years
- Some students will however choose to return for an additional semester or year - can only remain for a maximum of 34 credits
- Students with an IEP are exempt from this threshold


Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)

- Specialized program for students interested in pursuing a career in Manufacturing, Health and Wellness, Construction, Transportation, Hospitality or Arts and Culture
- Provides students with certifications and opportunity for work experience (must complete Co-op application and be accepted into program)
- Students will receive a specialized diploma when they graduate that will be recognized by workplace, colleges and universities

Which students are eligible to sign up for FSF101?

Arts Huron Program

- Students apply through the on-line application and are admitted through an audition(\$10.00)
- Students take 7 courses in their major and 1 other art course within 4 years
- curriculum fee of \$150.00/per year








When Adding Courses:

Keep track using the "Graduation Indicator"




You should have 8 courses unless you have selected a music repertoire class. This would make 9 courses.


