We affirm that we are all treaty people and acknowledge that the York Region District School Board is located on the lands of two treaties. These treaties have been signed with the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and the First Nations of the Williams Treaties who are: the Mississaugas of Alderville, Curve Lake, Hiawatha, Scugog Island; and the Chippewas of Beausoleil, Rama, and Georgina Island who is our closest neighbour and partner in education.

To honour this agreement we will take up our responsibility to be respectful of their traditions, knowledge and inherent rights as sovereign nations. We will respect their relationship with these lands and recognize that our connection to this land is through the continued relationship with these First Nations, and we acknowledge our shared responsibility to respect and care for the land and waters for future generations.

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

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



Pro Grant

Conduct several different virtual workshops to engage families in wellness to foster mental health, social inclusion, a safe and welcoming environment and to provide information to support school curriculum. All workshops will be done through the lens of social inclusion and racism with an emphasis on highlighting all of JRPS's diverse culture, race and abilities.

Examples:

- StoryTime have students send in their favorite short story books that resonate with their culture, race, ability and have a staff/parent/student read it.
- Demonstrate how to prepare and cook some of our JRPS families favorite food/snacks
- Staff present some fun curriculum type games that would engage students and parents
- Mindfulness / Yoga / body movement workshop
- Presentation of our EcoSchoolyard



Pro Grant Workshop Sub Committee:

- Survey the school population (students, parents, staff) on what types of workshops they
 would be interested in:
 - Timing (afterschool, evening, weekends)
 - Gather input on the type of workshops
 - Get data on the grade levels that would be interested in attending workshops
- Design the workshops using data from the survey
 - Find parents, staff, students, community members who would be interested in presenting
- Present the workshops virtually
- Budget is \$500
