4. Principal Report – L. La Marca

- March break next week
- Report cards went out last week (if parents didn't receive, can contact office)
- Grad: Booked Markham District H.S. and Pickle Barrel (don't know if we can have volunteers yet)
 - Would be nice to have former JRPS student volunteer (get volunteer hours)
 - Laura explained how things have worked in the past (parents decorating at the ceremony site and the celebration site)
 - o Regroup after March Break to move forward with plans
- Black History Month: Saidat showand Njacko Backo (musician sharing African instruments)
- Anti-Bullying Day/Pink Shirt Day: activities about kindness and "Culture of Care" (have been revisiting this idea throughout the year, more to come later this year)
 - Can align with ProGrant initiative: some possibilities "Get Real Movement Inclusivity" workshop (looking at how to share our diversity and personal narrative; focus on emotions, small acts of kindness)
 - Looking at various paid programing to meet school goals
 - Survey to go out to community to find out what parents want
 - \circ $\;$ Laura liked the expressing yourself idea $\;$
 - Heather liked that the programming is building on what has been done before and that there is a plan or a throughline; likes the mindfulness piece
 - Looking forward to having the tarmac/walls clean to paint/chalk it with the positivity

- Laura suggests signs on the doors with mindful messages
- Intermural with Mr. Minicuci: Volleyball and basketball; future pickle ball
- Lunch program starts after March Break; Laura is helping with pick-up of subs
- Recess Cart: equipment will be purchased once a survey of what the school has is done (Danielle Z. asked when/if that has happened yet)
- Additional funds acquired for Snack Program
 - Making lunches for students (purchasing items to put together lunches)
 - Will be helping provide particular students with lunches from the Lunch Program
 - Laura mentioned extra pizzas and other hot lunches can be frozen for future needs
 - Danielle asked if donations can be made to support students to get a hot lunch
 - Carolyn L. said funds can go into the Nutrition Fund toward supporting kids that don't have lunches
 - Laura suggested offering a donation option on the next round of ordering or a request for subsidy
- Looking for lunch monitors
 - Paid position
 - Looking to have all areas of the playground supervised
 - Laura volunteers to do Thursdays
- Arasalan asked about sending out of FlipGive reminder (some discussion about whether or not to continue to fundraise this year)
 - Carolyn suggests Arasalan and Laura have a discussion about future fundraising
 - The school would prefer to not have a huge fundraiser as covid has been a challenge financially for many and we want to be considerate of our families
 - Most effective fundraisers seem to be the small things like a toonie for a chocolate and a valentine (could do ice-cream or freezes)
 - Heather says she thinks it is ok to step back from the hard push to fundraise now that we are done fundraising for the Playground
 - A suggestion to wrap in TruEarth fundraiser information in the blast to parents
