## JRPS' Universally Accessible School Yard Featuring

### **Loose Parts Play**

#### 1. Why do we have a Loose Parts Play Area?

- We want <u>all</u> of our students to be able to play together using a variety of organic materials in an outdoor setting fairly and equitably regardless of ability.
- Our School Yard allows all students to apply what they learn from the Ontario curriculum.
- Our School Yard allows students to be physical, connect with nature and to reflect.
- JRPS' outdoor school yard allows students to practice skills they will be using when they join the workforce such as: cooperation, responsibility (character traits), team work, problem solving, care for the environment, using the imaginations to create innovative ideas, etc.
- Our School Yard is good for students' physical, emotional, social and mental health.
- Playing outside is safe in Canada and we dress appropriately for all weather (hot and cold).

#### 2. Who can play in Loose Parts Play?

- All students can play in our school yard. See the attached rotation schedule.
- Community members can use our school yard after school and on weekends.

#### 3. When can children play in Loose Parts Play?

- The general path area has multiple uses: biking and scooter riding, wheelchairs, walking/jogging, etc.
- The Loose Parts Play bunker is monitored by trained adults during morning recess and lunch recesses.
- Teachers can bring their classes out during school hours and use items in the bunker.
- During "asphalt only" recesses, students can use the path. The Loose Parts Play Bunker will remain closed as will the grassy area, the log forest, rocks/benches, sand pit, nest, etc.

# What are the features of Loose Parts Play and how can I use them safely?

Log Snake	Do not walk on the logs.	<ul> <li>May be slippery if wet or icy.</li> <li>No pushing each other off or fighting.</li> <li>No walking/ running on logs.</li> </ul>	It is intended for shaded seating.
Fence and Picture Frames	Do not climb the fence	Frames to stay on fence.	<ul> <li>Kids may weave materials in fence.</li> <li>May be used for fort building with wood and tarps etc.</li> </ul>
Log Forest	Do not climb on the logs.	<ul> <li>May be slippery if wet or icy.</li> <li>No pushing each other off or fighting.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>OK for running games, fort building, giant ring toss etc.</li> </ul>
Shaded stone seating in corner and low stone seats in mulch near tree	Do not stand on the logs/stone.	<ul> <li>Mulch stays off paved path.</li> <li>Broom in bunker to sweep it back under tree area.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Intended for shaded seating.</li> </ul>
Big rock near fence backdrop	Do not climb on the rock table.	<ul><li>No climbing on rock.</li><li>Slippery when wet or icy.</li></ul>	This is intended as a table and sign post.
Large, oval sand play area defined by low, stone wall  Black plastic pipe is an access point for kids who use wheelchairs.	Sand stays on the ground inside the pit! Paved Path	Keep bunker door closed so nobody walks/runs into it when traveling on path.  Grade south of portables is steep for wheeled vehicles.	<ul> <li>Bunker door may open/shut quickly in big wind.</li> <li>May be a slippery when wet or icy.</li> <li>Path is not maintained in winter.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>OK for kids to run or walk here, even during "asphalt only" recesses.</li> <li>Bikes/scooters used only after school hours.</li> </ul>
Mulch in rainbow shaped garden area	No running through grasses growing in mulched garden.	<ul> <li>All mulch stays off the trail/grass.</li> <li>Use broom in bunker to sweep off path/short grass.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>OK to sit in mulch and play.</li> <li>Future "web" site</li> </ul>
All Trees	No climbing, pulling branches. Leave mulch watering saucers and green Gator bags.		Intended to provide shade.     Sit under them.
Future Plant Material Tunnel	Please do not access when branches grow close to path	Prune branches back to make a tunnel.	Students can crawl into the tunnel.

### **Rules for Loose Parts Play Bunker**

- Bunker Key is in the office.

  Return when the bunker is locked back to the office.
- The bunker contains a variety of "open ended" items that can be used for building, sand play, games. These items change over time.













#### **RULES**

- ONLY adults unlock the bunker door (bunker door is heavy and when it is windy, the door can swing unexpectedly shut).
- Students line up at designated spot to access items from the bunker.
- Tidying up starts 5 minutes before the recess entry bell rings.
- Student volunteers can help put items back into bunker.
- Bunker has brooms for clean up in it. Students are expected to sweep misplaced sand/ mulch.
- The whole area must be left tidy items returned to their spots in the bunker or piled up outside.
- The whole area must be left clean no mulch/sand on trail.
- Branches and tree pucks may have to be piled outside, near bunker.
- Adults watch for broken, unsafe items and remove them from the bunker as needed.
- ONLY adults lock the Bunker door once all items are returned.

## **Breaking Loose Parts Play Rules**

Loose Parts items are returned back to the bunker immediately, bunker locked and no playing with the items until the following recess.
