### Web-based Technologies

Web-based technologies may be used in the classroom. Your child's teacher will communicate a list of which web-based technologies will be used as well as their applications.

# Safety and Security

Discussions will take place in our classrooms throughout the year about how to use information technology appropriately. These will include discussions on topics such as online safety and privacy, critical assessment of media and web sites, cyberbullying, and how to deal with inappropriate/uncomfortable situations that may arise when online.
