- 3. Principal's Report: Mrs. Angellotti

- o After school literacy and math programs are in place to support Junior and Intermediate students
- The second round of lunch programs has started in February
- Health and safety visits took place
- Active School Travel Campaign in effect
- Grade 8 Graduation Trip has been planned for later in the year –almost all Grade 8 students will be attending, some choosing not to attend, regular day of programming for them at school with activities planned similar to trip
- Winter Electives for Grade 4 6 students, have been chosen and planned for Monday, March 20th,
 Snow Valley-skiing and tubing, school- Winter fun activities
- O School Council Forum took place in February with a focus on student mental health
- o New staff were welcomed to replace teachers currently on maternity leave
- O No news in regards to the negotiations with the school unions

4. Community School Safety: Mrs. Angellotti

- o Incident that took place with a vehicle entering the school playground was discussed
- Council to confirm whether a small group of the community would like to create a committee to
 explore the option of creating barriers or building a gate around the school to reduce the likelihood
 of future incidents
- It was discussed that this incident was a rare instance but it's important to ensure students are kept safe at all times and exploring options is important

5. Traffic Update: Ruby Dhillon

- New signage will be put up to prevent families from stopping on Major Mackenzie to drop off children going to Tommy Douglas
- Continued efforts take place to discuss other ways to keep the community safe promoting walking to school, installing more signage and speed bumps to slow down traffic in school areas
- Reminder that the start time for Tommy Douglas will start at 8am in the Fall of 2023. Need to
 assess the impact of this change and whether this will be a positive or negative impact to the traffic
 in the community
