Grade 1 French Immersion INFORMATION SESSION

This year our Information session for **Grade 1 entry into the French Immersion (FI) program** will take place at Joseph A. Gibson on <u>January 19, 2023 – 7:00 pm in the gym.</u> If you're unable to attend the information session, you can hear all about the French Immersion program on the <u>Tune In YRDSB: French Immersion Podcast</u>. Gr. 1 French Immersion - REGISTRATION

French Immersion registration, for all NEW Gr. 1 students attending French Immersion in September, 2023, will begin on **January 20, 2023**. Parents or guardians of Senior Kindergarten students entering Grade 1 in 2023, and wishing to enrol in the FI Program, can email or call their home school office and indicate their intention to enrol. The home school will notify the French Immersion school, and the French Immersion school will contact you by phone or email to collect any necessary information. **You are asked to register by February 6, 2023**. Registration during this period is not first-come, first-served.

Late Registrations:

Late registrations are those submitted after February 6, 2023. Late registrations will be treated on a first-come, first-served basis and will be considered subsequent to registrations received during the registration period should overflow be necessary.

Parking Reminders

Familes are reminded to please to park on the road and walk your child in to the school when dropping them off in the morning, or picking up at the end of the day. The bus loop entrance is closed from 8:15-8:30 and from 3:00-3:15 every day in order to ensure the safe arrival and dismissal of students.

If possible, please park on Netherford (instead of on Naylon Street) as buses need to be able to drive in and out of the school safely during bus dismissal. Often times, cars are parked on the north side of Naylon right up to the stop sign making it very difficult for busses to drive out of the school and turn safely onto Netherford.

Dress for the Weather

If students are well enough to come to school, they are expected to go outside for recess. Our students benefit from spending time outside and being active. We monitor weather conditions throughout the day and if there are extreme weather conditions, we may consider a shortened or indoor recess. Students should come dressed appropriately for the weather and for outdoor play during recesses. They can stay warm by wearing layers of loose-fitting clothing, a hat, scarf, jacket, snow pants and mittens or gloves. Students may also want to bring extra clothing in case they get wet.
