IMPORTANT Safety Week Information – Sept. 25-29

The York Region School Board is committed to ensuring the safety of students, staff, building occupants and visitors in the event of an emergency. Medication



The safety of our students is paramount. Please inform the office of any medical conditions or allergies that affect your child by filling out all necessary Health Care forms. It is also a good idea to mention any significant health issues to your child's homeroom teacher. Children who need to take medication at school require a *Request for Administration of Oral Medication Form* signed by the parent before the medication is given to your child. If your child requires medication during the school day, please speak to the office staff.

Anaphylaxis Safety

School staff and parents are responsible for creating safe and healthy environments for students. This is an additional challenge for schools attended by children with allergies, especially life-threatening allergies. While we take every step to create a safe environment, school staff and parents can take important steps to minimize potentially fatal allergic reactions as there are implications for the whole school, not just individual classrooms. Several of our students have severe allergic reactions if they come in contact with certain allergens. Even a trace amount or airborne particles can trigger a reaction. We ask for your co-operation by please ensuring that your child does not bring any nut products to school. Thank you for helping making our school safe for all!

REMINDER - V.S.S. - Vulnerable Sector Screening

We always welcome parent volunteers in our school and on school trips; and if you <u>already</u> <u>have</u> a Vulnerable Sector Screening on file at our school, please come in and sign an **Offense Declaration form** that is required every September for the upcoming school year.
