Monthly staff meetings and PA days throughout the year allow us time to strategically plan for goal creation and the steps and resources necessary to reach our goals.

Each year, our students celebrate the long-standing tradition of Halloween by dressing up in costumes that meet our school's dress code. At this time, it is important to remember that the York Region District School Board's Safe Schools Policy #668.0 in accordance with the Ontario Safe Schools Act, includes the following criteria: A student shall not engage in the following act:

(a) possessing a weapon or replica weapon, including a firearm.

Students celebrating Halloween in costume at our school must comply with the above stated policy. Costume accessories including, but not limited to, toy guns, knives, axes, swords, etc. are not in compliance with York Region District School Board's Safe Schools Policy #668.0. Parents and guardians of all students are asked to look out for more detailed information from their child's teacher about expectations for that day.




