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# Administrator Message

We have had a very busy month at Joseph A. Gibson and students have been learning new routines and settling into their classes. It's amazing how smoothly transitions back to school can work when students, parents and school staff work together to address all of our students' needs. Our teachers are also working hard to collaboratively plan curriculum so every student in every classroom is getting a balanced program. We continue to focus our energy on student achievement; and overall success and well being at school. As a staff, we will continue to teach and develop good work habits with a focus on learning skills. Last month, Grade 3 and 6 EQAO results for Joseph A. Gibson (located on page 3) were released to the public. Within schools, EQAO data is used regularly to guide school improvement initiatives by helping identify areas of strength and areas needing improvement; and by helping support changes in instructional practices that may be required. Over the next several weeks, our leadership team will analyze our school results, along with several other sources of data to create goals for our School Improvement Plan with the objective of increasing student achievement and well-being.Monthly staff meetings and PA days throughout the year allow us time to strategically plan for goal creation and the steps and resources necessary to reach our goals.

Also, coming in November 2018, York Region District School Board will invite all students to participate in the Every Student Counts Survey (ESCS). This important initiative will help us work together to create equitable and inclusive school environments. Surveys are voluntary and confidential. At this time, it is important to remember that the York Region District School Board's Safe Schools Policy #668.0 in accordance with the Ontario Safe Schools Act, includes the following criteria: A student shall not engage in the following act:

(a) possessing a weapon or replica weapon, including a firearm.

Students celebrating Halloween in costume at our school must comply with the above stated policy. Costume accessories including, but not limited to, toy guns, knives, axes, swords, etc. are not in compliance with York Region District School Board's Safe Schools Policy #668.0. Parents and guardians of all students are asked to look out for more detailed information from their child's teacher about expectations for that day.





#### Step 1. Registration

The Online Registration window will open from 10:00 a.m. on **Friday, October 19th** to 11:59 p.m. on **Wednesday, November 7th**. There is a \$35.00 non-refundable registration fee.

#### **Step 2. Admissions Assessment**

When completing the online registration, students must choose one assessment time. Assessments will take place at Maple High School.

Option #1: Saturday, November 17

9:00 to 11:30 a.m.

Option #2: Thursday, November 22

6:00 to 8:30 p.m.

# The Grade 8 assessment for entry into the Grade 9 IB Preparatory Programme includes:

- testing of mathematics, English, and French;
- multiple choice test questions;
- results of Grade 7 report card;
- a written personal profile; and
- a Grade 8 teacher reference.

On the assessment day, please drop off your child at the front doors of Maple High School.

You will be able to pick up your child at the end of the assessment period either at 11:30 a.m. on the Saturday or at 8:30 p.m. on the Thursday.


# How to turn on/off Notifications in Edsby

With so many things happening inside Edsby, it is important to stay organized and up-to-date. Edsby makes this easy by enabling various notifications to ensure parents using Edsby are notified of the important things happening within their calendars, groups, Zand the schools their children attend.


1. From the Edsby HOME page go to your name that appears on the right side of the screen and click on it.



A menu of options will appear. Select "ACCOUNT SETTINGS".



- 2. Choose NOTIFICATIONS from the list.
- Choose your school name to get NEWS from your school by either email or push notifications. As you click on the blue titles you may choose how you would like to receive the notifications.




4. CHOOSE HOW YOU WOULD LIKE TO BE NOTIFIED BY CLICKING ON THE SMALL DOWN ARROW ON THE RIGHT BESIDE THE BOX. Choices include:

"Edsby": Edsby app notifications (iOS/Android app)

"Push": Browser notifications (Chrome/Safari/Firefox/Edge)

"Email": Email notifications




### **EDSBY MOBILE APP NOTIFICATIONS**

#### 6. Edsby Notifications

Edsby Notifications are notifications that occur directly in the Edsby interface. New notifications are visible as a red bubble counter next to the bell icon in the Navigation bar in both the web browser and Edsby app.



Click the X next to each notification to remove it from the list. The number of new items on the page will also appear in the tab of the browser Edsby is being accessed on.



#### **Email Notifications**

Email notifications are notifications sent to the email associated with the parent's Edsby account. For more information on Email Notifications and receiving daily Digest emails, click here. – make link to the part of the article where this is talked about

#### **Push Notifications**

Push Notifications are notifications that are sent to mobile devices. These can be sent at any time and parents with these turned on do not need to be in the Edsby app or on their device to receive them. Ensure Push Notifications are enabled for the Edsby App by enabling them in Settings of the mobile devices that Edsby is being accessed on. Push Notifications can show up as:

• Red bubble counters next to the app on the device



• Banners that show up along the top of the devices screen when the parent is currently using the device




• Banners that are visible on the lock screen of the device when not in use and remain until the device is opened



#### From the School Feed

Parents can also update their Organization notification settings directly from the school feed. Navigate to the feed of a selected school. Click the bell icon in the top right corner of the screen.




Here, parents can choose to be notified about News Items being posted in the school feed.

#### Group

Parents have the option to customize notifications for their groups. These notifications can be altered by selecting Notifications from Account Settings or by selecting Notifications directly from the feed of a specific group.

#### **From Account Settings**

Click the name of a group from Account Settings to select notification settings for it.



Choose a mode of notification – email, Edsby, or push – by clicking the drop-down menu under Notify Activity Via. More than one mode can be used. Edsby can notify parents of three different activities regarding their groups.
