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### Administrator Message

Each spring the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) administers testing in both Math and Language with all Grade 3 and 6 students across the province. This assessment allows your child to demonstrate his or her skills and knowledge in reading, writing and mathematics. The results are used to improve student achievement and learning. Although the students in grades 3 and 6 participate in the assessment, please know that the EQAO is an assessment of learning of the Ontario Curriculum Expectations from grades K - 3 (for the grade 3 students) and the learning of the Ontario Curriculum Expectations from grades 4 – 6 (for the grade 6 students). Detailed information pertaining to those grades and letters regarding any students who receive special accommodations has been sent directly to those parents concerned. These tests will occur in each elementary school from May 22 to June 1, 2018. It is important that all of our Grade 3 and Grade 6 children are at school and properly prepared to do their best during this testing period. Each test session will be approximately one hour in length. Please contact your child's teacher if you have any questions or think there may be any conflicts with those dates as attendance and proper rest will be highly beneficial during the testing period.

At Gibson, if you have a child in **Grade 3** or in **Grade 6**, please plan any personal appointments or outside activities to avoid our test dates of May 22 - June 1 inclusive.

This is also a FINAL REMINDER about the school organization for the 2018-2019 school year. We recognize that parents/guardians may have new and/or important information to share about their child (e.g., a recent medical diagnosis, peer relationships which exist outside of school, learning style, individual and family issues, etc.) which may impact class placement decisions. If you wish to share any information that should be considered as we begin to tentatively place students in classes in all divisions, I ask that you do so in writing and submit to Mrs. Fischer before May 15th.

Please be aware that any information you provide will be kept in confidence as part of the class placement process. Your input is valuable and I will certainly take it into consideration, but please do not consider it confirmation of a particular placement. Because of changing enrolment patterns in the spring and summer months, final class placement will not be shared until the first day of school in September.

In May and June, Gibson will be showcasing our student's many talents during our Track and Field Day, Jr. / Int. Spring Concert, Soiree Francophone, Kindergarten Celebration of Learning and our Talent/Art Showcase. More information is found for these many events in this month's newsletter. In addition, mark June 7th for our Talent Show and Arts Showcase and June 20th for Gibson's Spring Fair and BBQ. Looking forward to displaying our students' many talents.

### School Immunizations for 2018-19

In the 2018/19 school year, York Region Public Health will visit all elementary schools to provide school immunization clinics to Grade 7 students. The clinics offer vaccines for Hepatitis B, Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) and Meningococcal A, C, Y, W-135 at no cost.

Under the Immunization of School Pupils Act, meningococcal vaccine is required for school attendance, unless an exemption is filed with public health. Hepatitis B and HPV vaccines are recommended, but not required for school attendance.

Parents of students entering Grade 7 in fall 2018 will receive consent forms in the mail in June. Please complete the consent form and return it to York Region Public Health to allow your child to participate in the immunization clinics. Detailed instructions can be found on the forms and accompanying letter. If the consent form is not completed, your child will not be able to receive vaccines at the clinic.

Parents and guardians who do not consent should still complete the forms and return them, indicating that you do not authorize York Region Public Health to immunize your child.

Visit <u>york.ca/immunizations</u> and click on School Immunization Clinics for more information.

Did you know? If your child has missed a required vaccination on Ontario's routine immunization schedule, he/she can receive the vaccine at one of York Region Public Health's Community Immunization Clinics. These evening clinics are offered throughout the summer, giving students the opportunity to catch up before returning to school. Visit york.ca/immunizations and select Community Immunization Clinics to learn more.
