Lunch Ladies food program offers hot lunches on Wednesdays and Fridays Frozen Yoghurt sales by grade 8 students on Tuesdays and Thursdays. There has been a recent increase in the use of N-word amongst students and this organization will help all students understand the adverse impacts of these words.
