

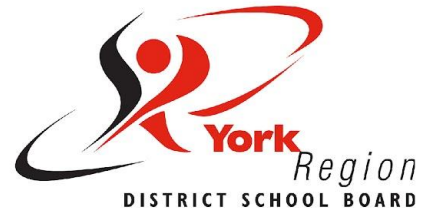

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

GRADE 9 & 10 PATHWAYS

APPLIED

Applied courses focus on the essential concepts of the discipline. Applied courses develop students' knowledge and skills by emphasizing practical, concrete applications of essential concepts of the course and incorporating theoretical applications as appropriate. Applied courses are more hands-on and experiential than academic courses. Includes: Workforce with the majority of work completed in class and/or in the workplace and direct to work. **"GRADE 10 CHOICE"**

LOCALLY DEVELOPED

Locally developed courses have been developed to meet the needs of students whose skills fall below grade level. It is a graded approach to learning using practical and relevant content. Includes: Career Development and Workforce with the majority of work completed in class and/or in the workplace and direct to work. **"GRADE 10 CHOICE"**

DE-STREAMED

De-streaming means that schools will no longer be offering courses in the applied stream. The intended concept of these students from multiple pathways research shows that de-streaming results in better outcomes for students and participating schools are: Mathematics - University, College, Apprenticeship and Direct to Work.

ACADEMIC

Academic courses focus on the theoretical concepts of the discipline and also explore related concepts. Academic courses develop students' knowledge and skills by emphasizing theoretical, abstract applications of the essential concepts of the course and incorporating practical applications as appropriate. Academic courses are more hands-on and experiential than applied courses. Includes: Workforce with the majority of work completed in class and/or in the workplace and direct to work. **"GRADE 10 CHOICE"**

Access My Pathway Planner (see instructions below). Utilize My Pathway Planner to research post-secondary programs/pathways and their requirements to develop a pathway plan. Engage in informed discussions about appropriate courses with parents/guardians, teachers and guidance counsellors.

LOCK IN WINDOW - Period of time during which students 'submit' online course selections through My Pathway Planner. Once you have reviewed your selections, send an approval email to a parent/guardian for final sign-off.

Choose course wisely because this is your final choice based on your interests.

TIPS FOR ONLINE COURSE SELECTION IN 'MY PATHWAY PLANNER'

STEP 1:

Access the Course Selection tool in 'My Pathway Planner' from the Keswick High School website. Click on the 'My Pathway Planner' icon. Login using your YRDSB student number and password. Using the left hand navigation menu, click 'High School' to create a plan.

STEP 2:

Add courses for next year in the high school planner. Click on to add a course. In the course selection and details screen, explore the available courses. The 'Finalization Indicator' will help you keep track of your progress. Click 'View progress' for a list of specific graduation requirements.

STEP 3:

Review and submit your courses. Check that you have a full course selection and have selected all compulsory courses needed. Prior to submitting, click on the 'review course selections' button and give your selections one final look over. When you are satisfied with your selection, click on 'submit course selections'.

STEP 4:

Once you have submitted your courses, you will be asked to provide a parent/guardian email. Speak with your parent/guardian about your course selections and please have them click 'approve selection' in the email that was sent to them. This completes course selections.

Diploma Requirements

FINANCIAL LITERACY REQUIREMENT

Starting in September 2025, students must earn a new financial literacy graduation requirement as part of their compulsory Grade 10 Mathematics course.

TECH AND STEM COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Students will also need to earn 1 credit from a STEM-related course group:

- Business Studies
- Computer Studies
- Cooperative Education
- Mathematics (in addition to the 3 compulsory)
- Science (in addition to the 2 compulsory)
- Tech Education (in addition to the 1 compulsory)
