OSSLT

All first time eligible (grade 10) and previously eligible (grade 11/12) students who have not yet met the Literacy Requirement for Graduation will be required to write the OSSLT in November. Students in Grade 10 will be writing the OSSLT over 2 days during their period 1 class. Students in Grade 11/12 will be writing the test over 2 days during period 1 in the library. Families of students who will be writing the test were sent specific details this morning via email.
