Opportunities for Self-Identifying Black Students

There are two upcoming field trip opportunities for YRDSB Black Students.

The first is a Master Class on **Friday February 17th**, entitled **Black Literacies-Music and Culture** featuring Dr. Mark Campbell DJ, author, scholar, assistant professor and curator. It is a full day event.

The second is an opportunity on **Tuesday February 28**, to engage with Dr. D'Wayne Edwards and Dion Walcott at **York University**. They will be sharing their pursuit in merging their identities, passion and entrepreneurial ventures to develop and lead established businesses and institutions. Students will also have the opportunity to explore York University, and the many educational opportunities offered there. It is a full day event.

Black Excellence Drummer Assemblies on February 21

The musical assembly presentation "Black Canadian Heroes" chronicles the lives and times of Canadians of African descent. From the activities of Mathieu de Costa (the first recorded black person in Canada) to the heroic deeds of figures of the underground railroad, your students will learn about the activities and contributions of black heroes like Josiah Henson (Uncle Tom) and Harriet Tubman (the woman called "Moses") Black inventors and scientists like Elijah McCoy (from whom we got the phrase "the real McCoy") and Dr. Anderson Ruffin Abbott (the first licensed Canadian-born black physician).

We will also discuss the contribution of war heroes like Richard Pierpont (the exceptionally brave black loyalist soldier) and William Hall (the first Black Canadian sailor as well as the first Black Canadian to receive the Victoria Cross). Students will understand and appreciate the labors of our heroes past should not be in vain.

Course Selection Information

This past month KHS Guidance Counsellors have been in classrooms delivering information regarding course selections for the 2023-24 school year. We have visited each grade and provided information and handouts on pathways, post-secondary research, how to select your courses through My Pathway Planner, and more.

Students can begin to submit course selections on February 16th and must submit by February 24th. All this information can be found on our KHS website under the Guidance tab.

Online Learning Courses and Online Learning Opt-out

With the requirement that students must now complete two online learning courses to achieve their OSSD (Ontario Secondary School Diploma), students now have the option to choose online learning courses through My Pathway Planner during course selection. These two online learning credits are apart of the thirty credits a student must achieve for their OSSD, not a requirement beyond the thirty. If a student wishes to select an online learning course, use the following steps to add it to their planner:

- Sign into their My Pathway Planner account using their YRDSB username and password. You
 must select 'login with school account' and then choose the 'York Region District School
 Board' first.
- 2. Click 'High School' on the left hand side navigation menu
- 3. To add a course, click the '+' button with the planner itself. All course disciplines will come up. Scroll down to look for 'Online Learning Courses'
- 4. Click on the course code 'ONLINE' and a description of the course will appear
- 5. While reading the description it will ask you to select the course of your choice. Choose one.
- 6. Then click the 'Add Course' button. This will add the online learning course to the planner.

If you and your child feel that completing two online learning credits does not fit their learning style, you can choose to have them opt-out. If a student chooses to opt out it does not affect their ability to graduate or post secondary pathways. If a student wishes to opt-out, use the following steps to complete this through course selection:

- Sign into their My Pathway Planner account using their YRDSB username and password. You
 must select 'login with school account' and then choose the 'York Region District School
 Board' first.
- 2. Click 'High School' on the left hand side navigation menu
- 3. Students will see an 'Online Learning Opt-Out' box in the first slot of their plan for next year. Click on the '+' button in the slot. If you do not see an 'Online Learning Opt-Out' box in the first slot no action is needed either the student has already opted out or will be asked to confirm their decision in a later grade
- 4. Once the student clicks on the '+' button, review the information in the description that pops up.
- 5. Click 'Add Course' if you wish to opt out of the requirement.

Updated Grade 10 Pathways

There is an update to course pathways available to students choosing Grade 10 courses for the 2023-2024 school year. KHS will now be able to offer applied pathway courses in both English (ENG2P1) and Science (SNC2P1). This is a change in previous plan to only offer the academic and locally developed courses.
