# MAKING CHOICES

# **ACADEMIC**

Academic courses focus on the essential concepts of the discipline and also explore related concepts. Academic courses develop students' knowledge and skills by emphasizing theoretical, abstract applications of the essential concepts of the course and incorporating practical applications as appropriate. Academic courses have more student initiated activities and the curriculum is delivered at a quicker pacerequiring work outside of the class. PATHWAYS - University, College, Apprenticeship and Direct to Work

# LOCALLY DEVELOPED

Locally-developed courses have been developed to meet the needs of students whose skills fall below grade level. It is a guided approach to learning using practical examples and concrete objects. Each student's strengths and needs will determine appropriate pathways through secondary school.

PATHWAYS - Some College programs, some Apprenticeships, Direct to Work and Community Living

### **DE-STREAMED**

De-streaming means that schools will no longer be offering courses in the applied stream. De-streamed courses will have students from multiple pathways. Research shows that de-streaming results in better outcomes for students and particulary those who are from marginalized communities.

PATHWAYS - University, College, Apprenticeship and Direct to Work.





# SUCCESS IN SECONDARY SCHOOL

Below are important skills necessary for student success

### **ATTENDANCE**

#### RECOMMENDATION

Students attend school every day and arrive to class on time.

#### WARNING SIGNS

Your child is missing school. Your child's report card shows more absences than expected.

#### **STRATEGIES**

Disuss your child's attendance record with the Vice-Principal and or reach out to school supports, such as Guidance, Student Services or Student Success.

# ORGANIZATION AND TIME MANAGEMENT

#### RECOMMENDATION

Take accurate notes and keep binders organized. Manage study time to prepare well in advance for tests.

#### WARNING SIGNS

Notebook and/or binder seems disorganized. Tests and assignments seem to be piling up and/or it is challengeing to keep up.

#### **STRATEGIES**

Create an agenda, discuss time management.

Speak with our supports such as Student Success,
Student Services or Guidance.

### **HELPFUL HINTS**

#### **Being Prepared for Class**

Getting your school supplies together in summer before school starts. Your teachers will help you with course specific materials needed for a course.

#### **Being a Successful Student**

Some academic difficulties can be solved with small changes. Attend class every day and go prepared. Speak with a Guidance Counsellor, SERT, or Student Success teacher.

#### **Getting to School**

Whether you take a bus or walk, have a plan well thought out ahead of time. Plan on arriving early and have a plan if you fall behing in the morning












# UNLIMITED POTENTIAL (UP MATH)



### **Unlimited Potential Math (UP Math) Program**

- Two credit package which includes:
  - 1) Grade 9 Learning Strategies course with an emphasis on Mathematics (GLS1O5) for students with no IEP, GLE1O5 for students with and IEP)
  - 2) Grade 9 Math (MTH1W5)
- Designed to help students build confidence, leadership skills, and a growth mindset in Math.




















#### **COURSE SELECTIONS DUE ONLINE: Friday, February 23rd @ 4:00pm**

Everything is completed online and approved by parent/guardian through email (no paperwork). Course selection information powerpoints and handouts can be found on the he KHS website, under the Guidance tab.

Access My Pathway Planner (see instructions below). Utilize My Pathway Planner to research post-secondary programs/pathways and their requirements to develop a pathway plan. Engage in informed discussions about appropriate courses with parents/guardians, teachers and transtions teachers.

**LOCK-IN WINDOW** - Period of time during which students 'submit' online course selections through My Pathway Planner. Once you have reviewed your selections, send an approval email to a parent/guardian for final sign-off.





# **COURSE SELECTION**





Access the Course Selection tool in 'My Pathway Planner' from the Keswick High School website. Click on the 'My Pathway Planner' icon. Login using your YRDSB student number and password. Using the left hand navigation menu, click 'High School' to create a plan.



Add courses for next year in the high school planner. Click on • to add a course. In the course selection and details screen, explore the available courses. The 'Graduation Indicator' will help you keep track of your progress. Click 'view progress' for a list of specific graduation requirements.



Review and submit your courses. Check that you have a full course selection and have selected all compulsory courses needed. Prior to submitting, click on the 'review course selections' button and give your selections one final look over. When you are satisfied with your selection, click on 'submit course selections'.



Once you have submitted your courses, you will be asked to provide a parent/guardian email. Speak with your parents/guardians about your course selections and please have them click 'approve selections' in the email. that was sent to them. This completes course selections.



Important to engage in early conversations with Grade 8 teachers if you are unsure about the appropriate course types to select.








# **COOPERATIVE EDUCATION**

Offered to Grade 11 and 12 students

Co-op/OYAP combines a subject studied in school with a related job placement out of school. Cooperative Education may be taken as a two credit (morning or afternoon) or four credit (all day) package. This program allows the student the opportunity to explore a career of interest, network with individuals in a particular career, develop job skills, obtain career-related practical experience, gather references for a résumé and develop attitudes necessary for success in the workplace.
