








COURSE PATHWAY OPTIONS FOR GRADE 9 and 10




It is important for students, and parents/guardians to remember that course and post-secondary pathways are changeable and flexible.

Students may choose all of the same course pathways or a combination


































Unlimited Potential Math (UP Math) Program

- Two credit package which includes:
 - 1) **Grade 9 Learning Strategies** course with an emphasis on Mathematics (GLS1O5 for students with no IEP, GLE1O5 for students with and IEP)
 - 2) Grade 9 Math (MTH1W5)
- Designed to help students build confidence, leadership skills, and a growth mindset in Math
- Students need to be recommended by their Grade 8 teacher




























