- 1 credit from Group 1 1 additional credit in English, or French*, or a Classical or International Language, or a Social Sciences and the Humanities, or Canadian and World Studies, or Guidance and Career education, or Co-operative Education**
- 1 credit from Group 2 1 additional credit in Health and Physical Education, or Business Studies, or the Arts (music, art, or drama), or French*, or Co-operative Education**
- 1 credit from Group 3 1 additional credit in Science (Grade 11 or 12), Computer Studies or Technological Education (Grades 9-12), French*, or Co-operative Education**

A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned in a Grade 12 compulsory English course.
