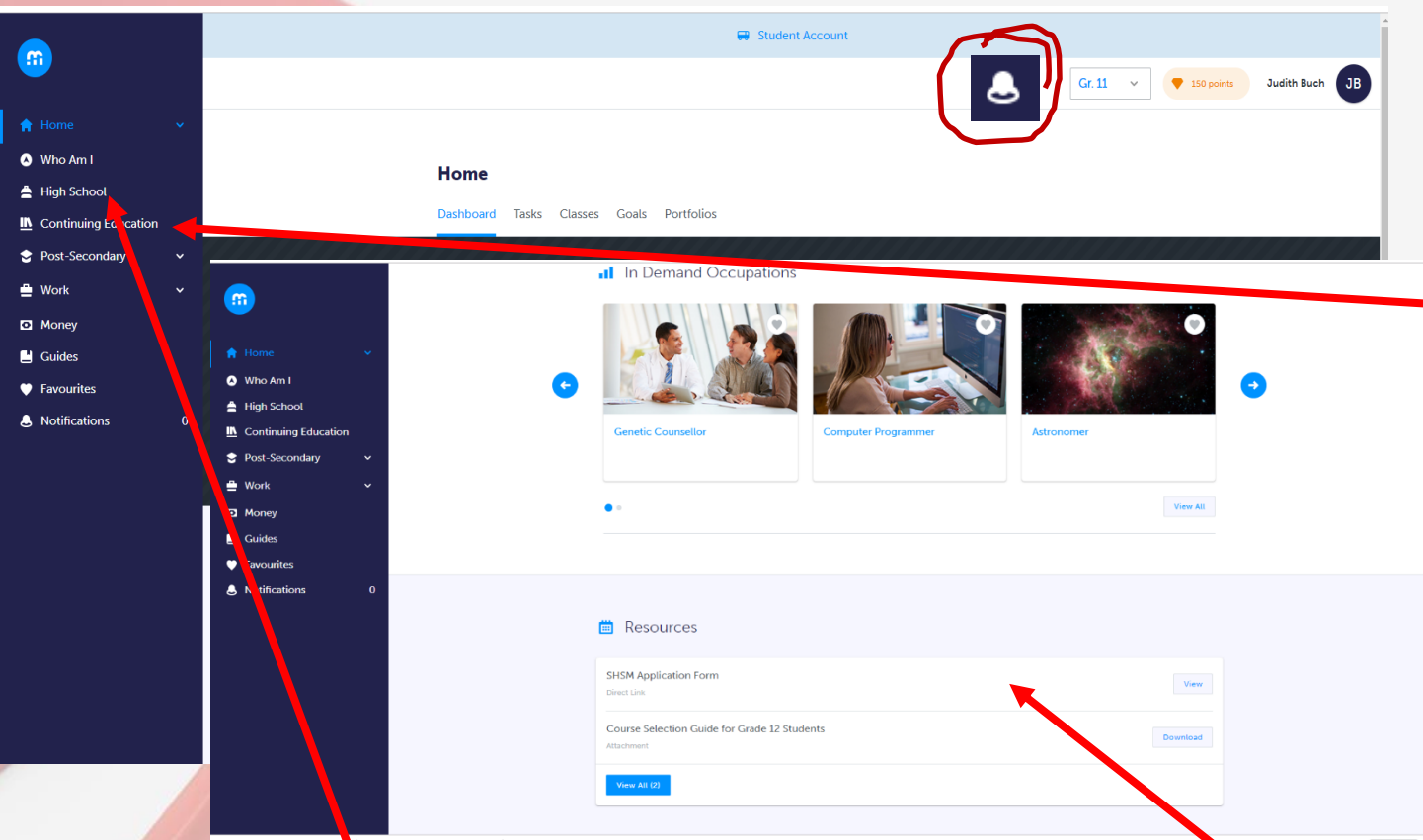

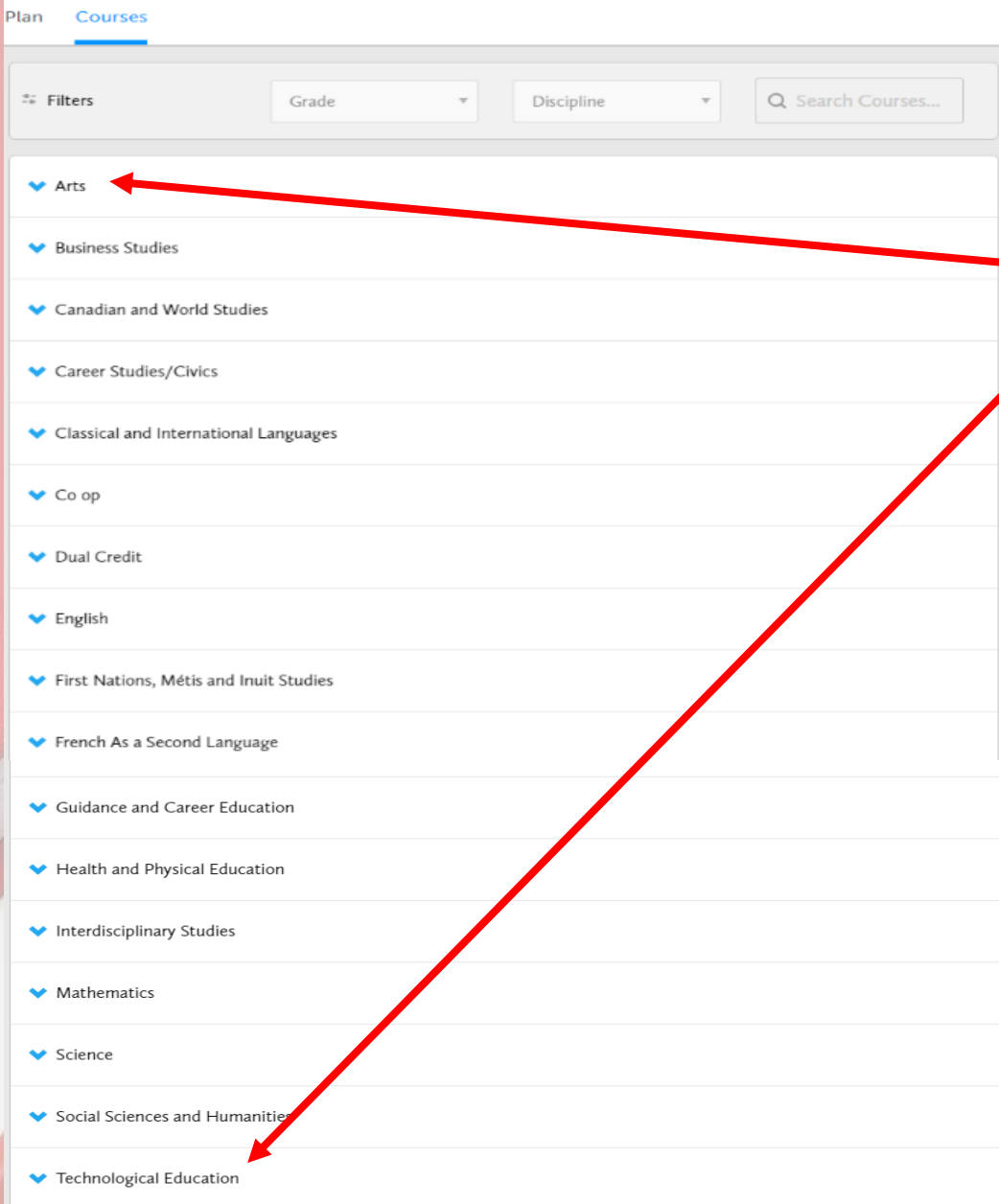

- By clicking on the Course Code you can see a description and prerequisites will be listed

# Things You Need to Know

- ▶ You will be restricted to a maximum of 4 credits beyond the 30 required for the OSSD
- ▶ Repeating a course counts as one of these 4 credits if you are beyond the 4 years allocated
- ▶ An identified student is exempt from this restriction
- ▶ You may spread the 4 credits out over 2 semesters
- ▶ Should you wish to do more than 4 credits beyond the 30 required for graduation, you will be directed to Night school or e-learning opportunities

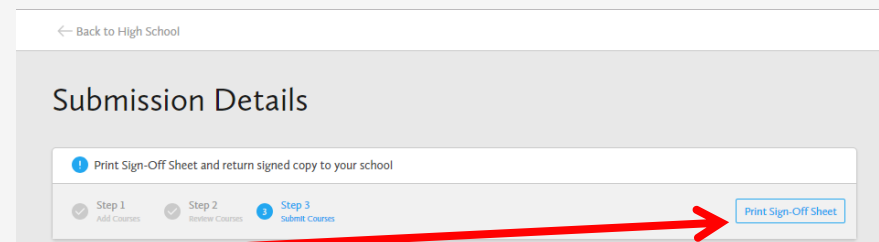
