






 Students with 24 credits by the end of grade 11 may leave 2 "Course" boxes blank
 All grade 12 course selections need 3 Alternates

- There is a 34 credit threshold. What does this mean for you?
- University bound students must have ENG4U1 plus 5 more Grade 12 "U" or "M" type courses

Other Considerations

- Colleges accept all SENIOR credits for admission (grade 11 and 12 courses)
- "M" type courses in grade 12 are appropriate if you are:
 - university bound AND/OR
 - they are related to your interests/career choice
- College and/or Workplace bound students should consider taking additional grade 11 credits from the wide selection available


