UP Math

- In second year of a pilot program
- It is for students who would benefit from reinforcement of essential skills
 - Not a gap or prep filling course
 - Students need to be working at the grade 8 level of mathematics
 - Students would take UP Math semester one and 9P math second semester
- Students need to be recommended by their grade 8 teacher
- Reinforcing concepts of mathematics along with organization skills, perseverance and growth mindset towards learning
