Exam Schedule

- All exams are written at 9:00 am unless your teacher tells you otherwise.
 - o For example, music exams are by appointment.



Exam Schedule

- o Thursday, January 25th: Period 1 exams at 9:00am
- o Friday, January 26th: Period 2 exams at 9:00am
- o Monday, January 29th: Period 3 exams at 9:00am
- o Tuesday, January 30th: Period 4 exams at 9:00am
- o Wednesday, January 31st: Practical Exams as scheduled + Inclement Weather Day (only if needed)

Inclement Weather Day



- o Wednesday, January 31st: Inclement Weather Day (only if needed).
 - If one of the previous exam days is a snow day, that day's exam would be postponed until January 31st.

Inclement Weather Day

- For example, if the Friday is a snow day the PERIOD 2 exams would be written on Wednesday, January 31st, the 'inclement weather day'
- The entire schedule does
 NOT get bumped.



Exam Review Day



- o **Thursday, February 1st**: Semester 1 wrap-up/exam review in the morning.
 - This is an important day to be at school.
 - You will follow your Semester 1 schedule. Each class is approximately 35 minutes.

Exam Review Day

- This is your <u>only</u> opportunity to review exams and final summatives.
- You must remain in the class for the entire period. Attendance is taken.
- No classes in the afternoon.
- Buses run on the <u>normal full-day</u> schedule.



Exam Schedule

- o Friday, February 2nd: PA Day (no school!)
- o Monday, February 5th: Semester two begins



General Information



- Before Exams:
 - o It is important to know where you are in terms of marks for each of your courses and how the exam can impact your final mark.
 - E.g. How 'much' each exam is worth? How the final 30% of your mark is calculated?

ELL and IEP Students

o If you have an IEP or if you are an ELL student you are entitled to extra time.



Students with an IEP

- Identified (Spec. Ed.) students will fill-out an extra time form if they plan to write the **entire** exam in the MPR.
- Forms are available in room 101.
- If you plan to write the exam in the classroom with the subject teacher, and then move to the MPR if extra time is needed, you will not need to fill-in this form.

ELL Students

• ELL students will write their exams with their subject teacher in the classroom and move to Gym 3 if extra time is needed.

ELL Students

- Extra-time forms are available from your ESL teacher, or see Ms. Williamson in room 218.
- You do NOT have to be registered in an ESL course this semester to qualify for extra time. (Students who have been speaking for less than 7 years can receive this accommodation, even if they are registered in all 'mainstream' courses. You MUST be on the ESL list if you are unsure, see Ms. Williamson.)

General Information

o Teachers are not available every day during the exam period. It is best to talk to your teachers and get questions answered **prior** to exams starting. If you need extra help, make arrangements **prior** to the start of exams.

General Information

o Relax! Sleep, a proper diet, and exercise will help reduce your stress levels and help your brain be prepared to study.







On the Day of Exams

- o No classes occur during the exam period.
 - Once you finish an exam you can go home, or study in the Cafeteria (study groups), or Library (quiet study), or Student Success (by appoint.)



On the day of Exams

- Cafeteria Hours: 8:00-2:45 NO FOOD
 SERVICE
- Library Hours: See Library doors for hours
- Room 93 (Student Success room): by appointment

On the Day of Exams

- o If there is a day you do not have an exam, you do not need to come to school.
- o Buses run at <u>regular times</u>, so if you would like to leave prior to 2:45, please arrange your own ride.



O No cell phones or 'smart' devices! Leave them at home, in your locker, or turned off in your backpack.



o Most exams are 1.5 hours. This is longer than a typical class. Be prepared to be there for the entire time. You cannot leave once you are done.


- o Bring a pen, pencil, ruler, eraser, calculator, etc. to all exams.
- o Electronic dictionaries or translators

 are not permitted. Make arrangements
 for paper dictionaries ahead of time.



- o Calculator apps on smart-phones <u>are</u>
 not permitted. Make arrangements to
 bring a non-programmable scientific
 calculator to your exams.
- o Remember to bring textbooks to exams!

o If you put your belongings in your locker you may not be able to access them until 11:00am.



- o Washroom breaks are for <u>emergencies</u> only.
 - If you need to use the washroom, you will be escorted through the halls by a teacher.



o Late policy:

- If you are less than 10 minutes late for an exam, go directly to your classroom.
 - You will be allowed the remaining time to complete the exam.

o Late policy:

- If you are more than 10 minutes late for an exam, go directly to the main office.
- You will be allowed the remaining time to complete the exam in an alternative location.



- o **Absences:** If you miss an exam, you will receive a "o%".
 - You are only allowed to write an exam at a later date if your absence is verified by a medical note, or court document. Expect to write your exam immediately upon your return to school.

o Absences:

- This may mean writing more than one exam in a day, as all exams must be completed within the exam schedule (by January 31st)
- Any courses that are incomplete valid reasons as of January 31st will receive a failing grade, and will be referred to Credit Recovery for completion in the new semester.
